Subject: GM731 Joel Kurokawa, Responses to Questions Nomination to the Board of Professional Engineers, Architects, Surveyors, and Landscape Architects

(1) Why do you wish to be a member of the Board of Professional Engineers, Architects, Surveyors, and Landscape Architects?

I have completed two consecutive terms as a landscape architect member on the EASLA Board, the most recent term ending in June 2020. I continue to serve on the Rules Committee of EASLA. During my time on the Board, I have learned a tremendous amount about the regulation of the allied design professions in Hawaii in general and about Landscape Architects in particular. Having served on the Board I appreciate the importance of the roles and responsibilities of the EASLA Board Executive Officer, PVL staff, and volunteer board members in protecting the health, safety, and welfare of the people of Hawaii by ensuring that the State's allied design professionals have documented relevant education, work experience and passed rigorous defensible standardized exams through the licensure process. I am interested is serving a new term because I feel I have more to contribute.

(2) What do you perceive are the roles and responsibilities of a member of the Board of Professional Engineers, Architects, Surveyors, and Landscape Architects?

As a Board member my roles and responsibilities are to adopt, interpret and enforce HRS Chapter 436B – Professional and Vocational Licensing Law and Chapter 464 – Professional Engineers, Architects, Surveyors, and Landscape Architects, to protect the health safety, and welfare of Hawaii consumers of services provided by the professions included above. Hawaii Administrative Rules, Title 16, Chapter 115 clarifies and implements HRS Chapter 464.

(3) Given your understanding of the roles and responsibilities of a Board of Professional Engineers, Architects, Surveyors, and Landscape Architects member, why do you believe that you are qualified for the position? Please include a brief statement of your skills, expertise and knowledge that would aid you as a member of the Board.

I am a licensed landscape architect with over 35 years of professional practice in Hawaii, California and Japan; own and operate an established firm in Hawaii with a diverse portfolio of project types, scale, located throughout the Hawaiian islands; have supervised and mentored landscape architecture interns preparing to qualify for and take the licensure examination; currently serve as a director on the Council of Landscape Architecture Registration Boards, CLARB, of which the EASLA board is a member of; previously served as Trustee of the Hawaii Chapter of American Society of Landscape Architects, and serve or have served on environmental non-profit organizations lending my professional expertise. All these experiences require me to have a clear understanding of the regulations, laws, and requirements governing the title and practice of landscape architects in Hawaii. I believe this qualifies me and will aid in my ability to serve as an effective board member of EASLA.

(4) What do you hope to accomplish during your term of service?

A goal I set for myself in my last term, but remains incomplete, is to establish Continuing Education (CE) requirements for Landscape Architects to maintain their Hawaii licenses. Hawaii is one of a small number of state jurisdictions across the United States that do not require its licensed landscape architects to earn CE credits as a condition for license renewal. Hawaii faces unique environmental, social, cultural, and economic challenges with increasing urbanization, global climate change and sea level rise, threatened fragile ecosystems, environmental and social justice for disadvantaged and underserved communities, and other critical issues. As such, it is critical that our design professions, including landscape architects, tasked with the physical planning and designing of our diverse communities, remain prepared and equipped with the latest technology, tools, theory and practice to address these 21st century issues. CE requirements for landscape architects will improve the HAR Title 16, Chapter 115 and ensure the continued protection of the health safety, and welfare of the people of Hawaii.

(5) Name three qualities that best describe you and how these qualities will benefit the Board of Professional Engineers, Architects, Surveyors, and Landscape Architects.

I am collaborative and work well in a group, action oriented, and organized. These qualities will help the Board get its work done in an efficient, timely, and pleasant, professional manner.

(6) Name a previous experience you've had that will be beneficial as a Board of Professional Engineers, Architects, Surveyors, and Landscape Architects member.

I serve and have served on other boards. Sometimes issues before a board can elicit divergent viewpoints and can sometimes cause divisions amongst board members. I have learned that it is critical that all board members perceive that each has an equal and fair opportunity to share their point of view without fear of ridicule or ostracism. When a board is respectful of each other it tends to operate more efficiently and effectively. I have experienced board meetings where best practices such as this one was not adhered to and the negative impact it had on the board member participation and overall board effectiveness.

(7) Can you foresee any possible conflicts of interest that could arise during your service on the Board of Professional Engineers, Architects, Surveyors, and Landscape Architects? How would you overcome conflicts of interest?

Yes. In fact, at my first Board meeting as an interim board member an employee of my firm applied to take the LARE and came up for board review and approval. Before board discussion of this candidate's application, I disclosed I have a conflict of interest because the candidate was an employee of my firm. While I participated in the discussion, I abstained from voting.
