### In consideration of GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE 744 SUBMITTING FOR THE CONSIDERATION AND CONFIRMATION TO THE ISLAND BURIAL COUNCIL, ISLAND OF O'AHU, GUBERNATORIAL NOMINEE, DIANE FITZSIMMONS FOR A TERM TO EXPIRE 6-30-24

The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports Governor's Message 744, nominating Ms. Diane Fitzsimmons to the Island Burial Council, Island of O'ahu expiring June 30, 2024.

The Island Burial Councils are established under Section 6E-43.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The Councils determine whether to preserve or relocate previously identified native Hawaiian burial sites, recognize lineal and cultural descendants, and provide counsel and advice to the Department.

Diane Fitzsimmons has cultural and genealogical ties to the Waialua moku. Ms. Fitzsimmons has a Humanities B.A. from West O'ahu College, with emphasis on Hawaiian Pacific history. She is also a graduate of Leeward Community College. Ms. Fitzsimmons currently works as a Department of Education substitute teacher at Waialua Intermediate and High Schools. She formerly worked as the Office Manager, Grants Administrator for Kokua Hawaiian Civic Club, Waialua Moku. Important to this nomination, Ms. Fitzsimmons has three years of experience dealing with burial issues as she has attended burial council meetings over the last three years as a recognized descendant of human skeletal remains located at Kawaiaha'o Church. This kind of hands-on experience and exposure is a valuable asset.

Senate confirmation will ensure that Ms. Fitzsimmons's knowledge and perspective informs the deliberations of the O'ahu Island Burial Council until June 30, 2024.
