## WRITTEN TESTIMONY IN SUPPORT OF GM 779

Dear Chair Kim, Vice Chair Kidani, and Members of the Senate Committee on Higher Education, it is with great humility that I write this letter of support for Doreen Nakamura, DNP, NEA-BC, CCM, Director of Clinical Care at UHA Health Insurance, for reconfirmation to the Advisory Board of the Hawai'i State Center for Nursing. In her one year of service, she has already demonstrated her commitment to HSCN's goals and mandates as well as to the nursing workforce of Hawai'i.
