In consideration of HOUSE BILL 1007 RELATING TO PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS ON CERTAIN STATE LANDS

House Bill 1007 proposes to decriminalize traffic infractions within natural area reserves, game management areas, wildlife sanctuaries, and public hunting areas. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) strongly supports this Administration measure.

Act 101, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, included an amendment to Section 184-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to decriminalize traffic violations within the Department's State Park System. This bill proposes to similarly decriminalize traffic violations in lands managed by the Department's Division of Forestry and Wildlife. Passage of this bill would simplify resolution of minor criminal offenses, reducing effort and resources expended on minor criminal offenses for the Department, police, prosecutors, the Judiciary, and the public. It is also consistent with other jurisdictions' treatment of parking as an offense.

The Department of the Attorney General (Department) submits the following comments:

The purpose of this bill is to revise the penalty provisions for traffic infractions within the Department of Land and Natural Resources natural area preserves, game management areas, wildlife sanctuarites, and public hunting areas, so that they are consistent with similar penalties for infractions in the state park system (Act 101, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008).

To avoid inconsistent application of the penalties, a clause should be added as SECTION 4, reading:

This Act does not affect the rights and duties that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were begun before its effective date.
