Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this bill.<sup>1</sup> The Campaign Spending Commission ("Commission") supports this bill.

This measure seeks to clarify Commission staff's authority to perform all day-to-day functions of the office, including the conducting of investigations and filing of complaints. Section 1 of the measure amends subsection (b) of Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") §11-311 by adding "staff" to the composition of the Commission. Section 2 of the measure amends subsection (b) of HRS §11-402 by including complaints initiated by staff to those initiated by the Commission.

Upon further consideration, instead of the proposed amendment to HRS §11-311, the Commission requests that this Committee replace the contents of Section 1 with the following:

Section 1. Section 11-314, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending paragraph (12) to read as follows:

"(12) Employ or contract with, without regard to chapters 76, 78, and 89, persons it finds necessary for the performance of its <u>day-to-day</u> functions, including a full-time executive director, and to fix their compensation; provided that the commission

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shall have the authority, at its discretion, to dismiss persons employed by or contracted with the commission; provided further that any persons employed or contracted by the commission shall have the authority, without further commission action, to perform the day-to-day functions of the commission;"

The Commission urges this Committee to pass this measure with the amendment to Section 1.

## in consideration of HB 146 RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING COMMISSION STAFF.

Chair McKELVEY, Vice Chair WILDBERGER, and Members of the House Government Reform Committee

Common Cause Hawaii provides comments on HB 146, which clarifies that Campaign Spending Commission personnel includes staff and that the staff may initiate complaints on behalf of the commission.

Common Cause Hawaii is a nonprofit, nonpartisan, grassroots organization dedicated to reforming government and strengthening democracy through improving our campaign finance system with laws that amplify the voices of everyday Americans.

HB 146 appears, at page 1, line 3, to inadvertently elevate the Campaign Spending Commission's staff and personnel to the level of the Commission itself by providing that the "commission shall consist of staff and five members . . . ." According to Hawaii Revised Statutes § 11-314(12), the commission employs the executive director and staff of the Campaign Spending Commission. HB 146 may be revised to provide that the Commission delegates to the executive director and staff the authority to initiate complaints and other administrative functions on behalf of the commission.
