Testimony of the Hawaii State Association of Counties on H.B. 160 Relating to Registration of Vehicles. Committee on Transportation Friday, February 5, 2021, 10:00 a.m. Room 423

The Hawaii State Association of Counties (HSAC) strongly supports H.B. 160, which establishes a single \$2 registration fee for motor vehicles to be used by the counties for highway beautification and to defray the additional cost of disposing abandoned or derelict vehicles.

Currently, this fee is \$1 for U-drive motor vehicles and \$2 for other motor vehicles, which may be raised by the counties by ordinance up to \$10. This fee is inequitable because the use of highways and roads by U-drive vehicles is as intense, if not more intense, than other motor vehicles on our highways and roads. Changing the fee to \$2 for all vehicles would be a more equitable application of the fee.

For these reasons, HSAC supports H.B. 160. Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony on H.B. No. 160.
