TO THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

ON HOUSE BILL NO. 199, HD 1

RELATING TO ELECTION PROCLAMATIONS

March 18, 2021

Chair Rhoads and members of the Senate Committee on Judiciary, thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of House Bill No. 199 HD 1. This bill repeals the requirement that election proclamations contain a statement of the time and places where an election is to be held; and specifies that the county clerk, not the chief election officer, shall issue an election proclamation listing information on voter service centers and places of deposit.

Our office supports this bill as it improves the administration of elections by mail by clarifying that the county clerk issues proclamations relating to the voter service centers and places of deposits they have established. This will ensure timely issuance and dissemination of information to voters. For example, in the case of a natural disaster impacting a location or hours of operation at a voter service center or place of deposit, the county clerk should be able to quickly determine their course of action and inform the public rather than coordinate with our office to provide the information.
