**Purpose of Bill:** Requires persons who receive state funds and state financial assistance to donate unnecessary but functioning electronic devices, hardware, and televisions to nonprofit organizations that will refurbish and distribute them to eligible persons in the State. Sets reporting requirements for donating entities, nonprofit refurbishers, and the department of accounting and general services. Sets penalties for violations. Effective 7/1/2112. (HD1)

#### **Department's Position:**

The Department of Education (Department) supports HB 516, HD1 requiring recipients of state funds and financial assistance to donate unnecessary but functional electronic devices, hardware, and televisions for refurbishment and distribution to eligible persons in the State.

Access to devices and technology resources for low-income families and other populations in need of access is a long-standing issue. The issue became more evident with the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, which required the people of the state to work and learn remotely. The Department appreciates that this measure recognizes the need for access to technology resources by proposing a cost-efficient solution that is also sustainable and environmentally responsible.

My name is Curtis Kropar, Executive Director of the non profit organization, Hawaiian Hope Org.

As you may know, Hawaiian Hope Org has been refurbishing computers in Hawaii for 14 years now. We take in donated computers, fix them up and then redistribute them to other non profit organizations, local families and students for home.

This photo to the right is one of our distribution events for Christmas 2019, where we gave away 375 computer to the students of a school in Ewa Beach. The computers are for the students to take home, not for the school. This ensures that not only the students will have access to a computer when they need it, but the whole family can benefit from having a computer in the home.



To our knowledge, Hawaiian Hope Org is the single largest refurbisher of computers in the state.

In 2018 we produced over 1,000 computers, and, in 2019 we produced over 1,800 computers.

With this bill, HB516, we, and other non profits in Hawaii, could now have the opportunity to get access to a much larger quantity of computers from the state, that are otherwise often discarded as eWaste. We estimate this to be over 40,000 devices a year and we appreciate your efforts to make it happen and help us get even more computers and technology into the hands of the people that need it.
