Department's Position:

The Hawaii State Department of Education (Department) respectfully provides comments on House Bill 521, which seeks to amend the duties of the Committee on Weights (Committee) contained in Chapter 302A-1303.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), by adding a requirement to submit a report to the legislature detailing any changes to the funding formula within thirty days of the change.

The final report from the Committee on changes to the Weighted Student Formula (WSF) is subject to the approval of the Hawaii State Board of Education (Board) (HRS 302A-1303.6) and, therefore, may not reflect the actual implementation of the proposed change to the formula.

The final Committee report is included in the memorandum to the Board for consideration, which is posted to the Board's website in accordance with HRS Chapter 92.
