H.B. 601, H.D. 2 RELATING TO THE TRAFFIC CODE

House Committee on Finance

The Department of Transportation (DOT) **supports** H.B. 601, H.D. 2 which proposes to amend the statewide traffic code to allow for the County Chiefs of Police to designate county employees to issue citations for traffic violations.

Certain locations on the State Highway system are located in the vicinity of recreation areas which are attractions to residents and visitors alike. Many of these attractions lack adequate facilities to accommodate the often-heavy demand for parking, and as a result, vehicles are often parked along the State highway in locations which result in hazards to pedestrians, cyclists and motorists. In response, DOT has coordinated with local law enforcement in the establishment of No Parking zones to address these hazards. While local law enforcement has played a significant role in supporting the No Parking zones by issuing citations, resources are limited such that regular enforcement of the No Parking zones is not feasible. H.B. 601, H.D. 2 provides an opportunity for additional manpower to issue parking citations in these areas, which will enhance the safety of the State Highways for all users.

H.B. 601, H.D. 2 - RELATING TO THE TRAFFIC CODE

The Hawaii Government Employees Association, AFSCME Local 152, AFL-CIO provides comments on H.B. 601, H.D. 2 which amends the statewide traffic code to authorize County Police Chiefs to designate other county employees, such as trained county staff or park rangers to cite for certain traffic violations. This is not a daily function for positions outside of law enforcement and designating this task to other county employees significantly impacts an employee's condition of employment, and the terms must be negotiated and mutually agreed upon. It also raises issues of liability for affected employees and the counties.

Law Enforcement Officers have been trained and possess the skill set to enforce and address violations in accordance with law. Further discussions are necessary to assess which trained county staff are being considered to perform these tasks.

I strongly urge you to support HB 601 HD2.

Illegal parking has for a long time created serious congestion and safety problems on Kauai's north shore. The well-known lack of a sufficient number of police officers to enforce parking regulations further encourages drivers to ignore parking regulations, secure in the knowledge that it is very unlikely that they will be cited.

By enabling county police departments to designate other county employees to issue citations, HB 601 HD2 would help to restore credibility to the state's parking regulations, increase compliance with those regulations, and reduce congestion and increase safety along the affected highways and roads.

It is crystal clear that there is a great need for this long-overdue legislation, that its passage would be in the public interest, and that there can only be benefits (and no harms) if this legislation is passed. Therefore, if there are any implementation details that need to be worked out, they can certainly be dealt with after this legislation is approved.

For these reasons, please vote in favor of HB 601 HD2.
