In consideration of HOUSE BILL 774, HOUSE DRAFT 1 RELATING TO DEVELOPMENT DISTRICTS

House Bill 774, House Draft 1 proposes to establish the Pulehunui Community Development Authority as an autonomous community development authority under the Hawaii Community Development Authority (HCDA) for the purposes of developing the Pulehunui community development district. The measure also proposes to authorize the HCDA to obtain various forms of federal funding for construction, maintenance, and development projects in the Pulehunui community development district. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports this measure.

The proposed Pulehunui community development district would include the parcel that serves as the project site for the Department's proposed industrial and business park. The Department desires to develop an approximately 280-acre portion of the property identified as Tax Map Key (2) 3-8-008:001 for a light industrial and business park. The Department intends to lease a variety of small, medium and large lots to private lessees for the purpose of generating income to support the Department's resource protection programs. This project will also require the provision of necessary infrastructure, including water and wastewater systems. The Department has been working with other State and county agencies in order to address these issues. This measure would provide a significant financial opportunity to successfully provide the necessary infrastructure to not only the Department's project, but other proposed State and County projects in the immediate vicinity.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of House Bill 774, HD1. Thank you for this opportunity to testify with **CONCERNS** over HB774, HD1.

As you know, Hawaii has a complex land use regulatory scheme. Because of, or in spite of, these multilayered regulations, Maui County has made a great effort in general and community planning. These plans are intended to allow for targeted growth in areas where such growth can be served by infrastructure, among other criteria. When proposed development does not comply with these plans, amendments are needed – a process that allows agency and public review to ensure overall compliance and compatibility.

HB774, HD1 <u>suggests</u> but is not explicit that development within the Pulehunui Community Development District does not need to comply with these plans. Proposed subsection 206E-E(4), beginning at line 8 on page 6, states *"Land use and development activities within the district shall be coordinated with and, to the extent possible, complement existing county and state policies, plans, and programs affecting the district...."*

County and State land use regulations must apply to this area, including zoning, community plan, Maui Island Plan and state land use districts. "Coordinating with" and "complementing" these regulations "to the extent possible" is not sufficient to ensure compliance with these regulations that were years in the making, involving hundreds of citizens, the Maui Planning Commission and the Maui County Council. We request that the language be amended to read: "Land use and development activities within the district shall [be coordinated with and, to the extent possible, complement existing] comply with applicable county and state policies, plans, and programs affecting the district...."
