Aloha Chair Shimabukuro, Vice-Chair Keohokalole and Members of the Committee:

The Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL) supports this bill authorizing the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds for a master planned development proposed by Pueo Development, LLC on Hawaiian Home Lands.

The Hawaiian Homes Commission (HHC) voted in August 2019 to approve the issuance of a Right of Entry permit to Waiohuli Hawaiian Homesteaders Association, Inc. (WHHA) for approximately 150 acres of Hawaiian home lands for the purpose of conducting due diligence studies including but not limited to project master plan, business plan, and related Chapter 343, HRS compliance requirements and Chapter 6E, HRS compliance requirements.

WHHA submitted a land use request to DHHL on December 3, 2018 with a proposed plan including development of residential and agricultural lots, economic and educational opportunities, energy projects, and water source development through collaboration and partnerships which would result in career development and employment opportunities. A beneficiary consultation meeting was conducted on May 30, 2019 to collect beneficiary input and feedback on WHHA's land use request. A beneficiary consultation report was submitted to the HHC in July 2019 for acceptance.

The Department of Budget and Finance offers the following comments on House Bill No. 776, H.D. 1, which authorizes the issuance of Special Purpose Revenue Bonds (SPRB) to assist Pueo Development, LLC, a Hawaii limited liability company, with the proposed master planned development that will include low- and moderate-income homes; rental housing units; elderly care units; alternative energy development; agricultural development; and infrastructure development, including roads and utilities pursuant to Parts IV and IX, Chapter 39A, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

The Department has a comment on this bill. We, the Department and the Attorney General, have consistently interpreted Article VII, Section 12, of the Hawaii State Constitution, to authorize the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds for only a single part of Chapter 39A, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

The Department would like to inform the Legislature and prospective SPRB parties that should the legislation be approved, approval of the SPRB issuance and conduit loan will require further review of the financing proposal to ensure compliance

Chair Shimabukuro and Members of the Committee:

The Department of the Attorney General (Department) provides the following comments regarding this bill.

This bill authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds pursuant to part IV, assisting processing enterprises, and part IX, assisting organizations in the development of low and moderate income housing, chapter 39A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for a master planned development proposed by Pueo Development, LLC, on Hawaiian Home Lands.

The Department believes that the authorization of special purchase revenue bonds under two parts of chapter 39A, parts IV and IX, is incorrect. Article VII, section 12, of the Hawaii State Constitution, which establishes the constitutional framework for the issuance of special purpose bonds, does not authorize the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds for more than one part. Also, parts IV and IX of chapter 39A, which establishes the statutory framework for the issuance of these special purpose revenue bonds, does not authorize the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds for more than one part.

Given that the primary objective of the bill is to develop low and moderate income housing, the Department recommends that the references to part IV of chapter 39A in

sections 2 and 3 of this bill be deleted. The issuance of such bonds pursuant to part IX is sufficient and appropriate.

We respectfully ask the Committee to pass this bill with the recommended amendments

The goal of Project: WE-DO is to create long-term, economic development opportunities for WHHA's community THROUGH development including:
