I am Major General Kenneth S. Hara, State Adjutant General and the Director of the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency. I am testifying in **SUPPORT** of House Bill 962.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide written testimony on behalf of the Department of Defense which supports HB962, Making Emergency Appropriations to the Department of Defense Relating to COVID-19 Expenditures.

Highlights of the Emergency Appropriation request funding for the States Safe Travels Program, Call Center Operations, National Guard state match requirements to federal funding, procurement, storage and distribution of personal protective equipment.

The department changes the overall request from our original Emergency Appropriation request from \$25, 545,290 to \$13,602,351. The following is the breakdown of the budget request:

The Safe Travels Hawaii funding of \$9,394,908 to \$8,413,549,

Call Center Funding from \$600,000 remains the same,

Funding for National Guard support from \$22,500 to zero,

Screener tablets for \$90,000 to zero (Included in Safe Travels funding),

PPE/Warehousing/Distribution from \$15,427,882 to \$4,588,802

Reductions are based on new projection based on actual expenses and the anticipation that Hawaii National Guard funding through this state fiscal year will be 100% federally funded.

Chair Ichiyama, Vice Chair Eli and Members of the Committee:

The Hawaii Primary Care Association (HPCA) is a 501(c)(3) organization established to advocate for, expand access to, and sustain high quality care through the statewide network of Community Health Centers throughout the State of Hawaii. The HPCA <u>SUPPORTS</u> House Bill No. 0962, MAKING EMERGENCY APPROPRIATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE RELATING TO COVID-19 EXPENDITURES.

The bill, as received by your Committee, is part of the Administration's Package, and would appropriate in general funds for fiscal year 2020-2021, to the Department of Defense (DOD) for the continuation of various COVID-19 related relief and support programs.

By way of background, the HPCA represents Hawaii Federally-Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs). FQHCs provide desperately needed medical services at the frontlines in rural and underserved communities. Long considered champions for creating a more sustainable, integrated, and wellness-oriented system of health, FQHCs provide a more efficient, more effective and more comprehensive system of healthcare.

When our citizens first became infected with COVID-19 in February 2020, Hawaii's social safety net was not prepared. Basic necessities such as surgical and N-95 masks, gowns, shields, and other personal protection equipment (PPE) quickly became scarce. For our 15 FQHCs, very limited resources became stretched to the breaking point forcing providers to limit the provision of health care services in some instances.

I'm pleased to say that the system did not shut down because of the dedication and selfless actions of providers working with community leaders, legislators, the Governor and his Administration, and the Mayors and their Administrations to keep the safety net afloat.

It cannot be overstated that these actions saved countless lives in Hawaii.

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The supply of PPE has stabilized due in large part to the efforts of the DOD and private partners, among others. Not only had the DOD helped to acquire large amounts of PPE, they were instrumental in storing and distributing these vital materials to health care providers situated across our islands.

This was a monumental job that the DOD did selflessly because it had to be done for the good of our People. For that, the HPCA wishes to thank them for truly being our heroes.

For these reasons, the HPCA urges your favorable consideration of this important measure.
