Testimony in Support of HCR 144: DESIGNATION OF THE REEF RUNWAY AS THE FRANK T. OKIMOTO REEF RUNWAY.

The Reef Runway at the Daniel K. Inouye International Airport is truly an unsung hero among our state's critical infrastructure: essential to tourism and air travel of local residents; vital to the air transport of essential goods and supplies; and innovative as the world's first major runway built offshore – creating the vast acreage required in an innovative and environmentally responsible way.

Likewise, the expert, committed work of civil engineers throughout Hawai`i can often be taken for granted. While educators and business leaders urge the promotion of STEM learning and careers, an impactful way to draw positive attention to excellence and achievement by homegrown engineering talent within the State of Hawai`i Dept. of Transportation would be through the designation of the Reef Runway as the "Frank T.
