#### **Budget Request for Fiscal Biennium 2021-2023**

Chairs Dela Cruz and Baker and Members of the Committees:

My name is Catherine Awakuni Colón, and I am the Director of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs (DCCA or Department). I appreciate the opportunity to discuss the Department's fiscal year (FY) 2022 – 2023 budget with the members of the Committees.

#### **Overview**

The mission of the DCCA is to protect Hawaii's consumers and service its business community with respect and fairness to the interests of both.

The Legislature established the DCCA's funding structure by creating the compliance resolution fund (CRF) in 1996. This special fund is the primary funding source for the DCCA's programs. As a special-funded department, the DCCA receives no general funds; its divisions secure revenues to cover their expenses and contribute equitably to overhead costs, and they maintain sufficient reserves to address unexpected contingencies and anticipated major improvements. Maintaining adequate

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reserves ensures fund solvency and the delivery of critical commerce and consumer protection services. Since the onset of the CRF, the Department's primary fiscal goal has been to implement this strategy through conservative spending and adjusting its expenses to align with projected revenues. Accordingly, the DCCA's financial strategy accounts for current FY expenses, as well as future major projects and expenditures.

The Department's budget requests fall into two primary categories: (1) information technology (IT) resiliency, replacement, and enhancement; and (2) building resiliency. The DCCA's strategic planning over the past year has largely focused on the need to align IT planning and implementation with the evolving needs of its stakeholders. The COVID-19 pandemic has brought renewed urgency to the Department's need to replace critical legacy systems, address pain points in its workflows, and ensure that its work is performed efficiently, regardless of the location of the employee or the customer.

#### Impact of Current Economic and Fiscal Conditions

Because the Department does not receive general funds, current economic and fiscal conditions have impacted the DCCA primarily through potential reductions in fees and fines that the Department receives. Fortunately, departmental revenues have remained stable, and the DCCA has sufficient projected revenue to fund its budget requests. The Department anticipates that its enforcement divisions will experience an uptick in investigations relating to financial irregularities and consumer scams, and information about landlord-tenant issues will continue to be in strong demand.

#### **Federal Funds**

None of the Department's programs have lost or are at risk of losing federal funds.

#### **Budget Requests**

The Department formulated a budget that provides the resources necessary for its programs to perform their functions and meet their goals and objectives. Pursuant to

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instructions in Finance Memorandum 20-15 issued by the Department of Budget and Finance, notable requests in the current budget include:

- **IT enhancements**. The DCCA's IT budget requests reflect a continued commitment to enhancing the DCCA customer experience by:
  - Replacing the Business Registration Information Management System (BRIMS) and Registration Documents Processing Management System (RDPMS) of the Business Registration Division (BREG) with a unified system, as well as scanning old active files to incorporate them into the replacement system (ceiling increase to BREG of \$3,500,000 for FY 2022; \$500,000 recurring);
  - Replacing the core switch and firewall server hardware (ceiling increase to the Information Systems Communication Office (ISCO) of \$175,000 for FY 2022, \$46,000 recurring);
  - Providing an IT integration platform to facilitate the transition to new systems (ISCO, \$125,000 recurring);
  - Purchasing VxRAIL software (ISCO, \$100,000 recurring); and
  - Replacing an outdated access control system and car printer (ISCO \$75,000 for FY 2022, \$30,000 recurring).
- King Kalākaua Building. The DCCA requests a ceiling increase of \$700,000 for FY 2022 and \$1,050,000 for FY 2023 to replace the King Kalākaua Building's cooling towers, repair roof damage caused by Hurricane Lane, and repair supporting columns. In addition, if the Department is awarded a pre-disaster mitigation grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency to harden the roof and disaster operations center in the King Kalakaua Building, it will be required to provide matching funds.
