TESTIMONY OF BONNIE KAHAKUI, ACTING ADMINISTRATOR STATE PROCUREMENT OFFICE

> SENATE BILL 1035, SD2, HD1 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT

Chair Johanson, Vice Chair Kitagawa, and members of the committee, thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony on SB 1035, SD2, HD1 - Relating to Procurement. The State Procurement Office (SPO) is in strong support of this bill and appreciates further discussion on this bill.

Background Information and Justification

1) Procurement Automation System

In response to the COVID-19 public health crisis, the Hawaii state government has moved to digitize its processes and conduct business online to continue its current level of customer service.

In support of that move, the SPO seeks to transition its manual procurement processes to an online digital system – a procurement automation system – to increase efficiency, save personnel time, create a consistent "face" for the executive branch, ease contractor confusion, and exact better spend data to leverage economies of scale. Other positive impacts include faster access to government goods and services; digital and transparent spend data; improved, user-friendly procurement templates; SPO response to and guidance for complex procurements; and faster and enhanced sharing of information by agencies.

2) Financing the Procurement Automation System

The COVID-19 public health crisis resulted in budget cuts, and SPO is looking at ways to remain financially sustainable while providing procurement services and guidance pursuant to Chapters 103D and 103F of the Hawaii Revised Statutes. Senate Bill 1035 SD2SD1 will allow the State Procurement Office to charge an administration fee and deposit revenues into a special fund and to expend the funds for the project management of the procurement automation system.

The SPO is proposing to collect an administrative fee that will pay for the procurement automation system, saving approximately \$1.2M of general funds each year. In addition, the fee will assist in paying for a program management team to manage and grow the automation system to ensure statewide access for the full life-cycle, and to receive monies paid to the state.

The administrative fee is dependent on the responses SPO receives from the competitive solicitation for a Procurement Automation System and should not be subject to chapter 91, HRS. The fee will only be imposed on purchases made from/through the automated system. Therefore, we recommend the following revisions:

Section 3, page 6, lines 8-10, to read:

(7) Assess and collect an administrative fee pursuant to chapter 91 to cover procurement automation system costs.

Chair Johanson and Members of the Committee:

I am Tim Lyons, President of the Subcontractors Association of Hawaii and we have some concerns about this bill. The Subcontractors Association of Hawaii is composed of the following nine separate and distinct subcontracting organizations which include:

> HAWAII FLOORING ASSOCIATION ROOFING CONTRACTORS ASSOCIATION OF HAWAII HAWAII WALL AND CEILING INDUSTRIES ASSOCIATION TILE CONTRACTORS PROMOTIONAL PROGRAM PLUMBING AND MECHANICAL CONTRACTORS ASSOCIATION OF HAWAII SHEETMETAL CONTRACTORS ASSOCIATION OF HAWAII PAINTING AND DECORATING CONTRACTORS ASSOCIATION PACIFIC INSULATION CONTRACTORS ASSOCIATION ELECTRICAL CONTRACTORS ASSOCIATION OF HAWAII

The bill allows the Administrator of the Procurement Office to "[A]ssess and collect an administrative fee to cover procurement automation system costs", subject to Chapter 91. The addition of Chapter 91 is a good amendment. (Section 3 Section 103D-206(7).

We are however still unclear as to how this fee is going to be assessed. Is it assessed on all bidders; successful and otherwise or is it assessed only on the successful bidder? When is it paid? As part of the bid amount or is it assessed after the completion of the contract as a separate line item? Please note that obviously any fee tacked on to the procurement submittal will have an overall cost impact to the final cost of the job and, therefore to the taxpayers and the budget. We note that while House Standing Committee Report 1081 notes that the fee would be "less than 1%" there does not appear to be any parameters about the fee in the bill. We believe there should be.
