Testimony in SUPPORT of S.B. 1150, SD1 RELATING TO SKILLED NURSING FACILITY LICENSING

- 1 **Fiscal Implications:** No negative fiscal implications.
- 2 **Department Testimony:** Thank you for the opportunity to testify in STRONG
- 3 SUPPORT on this measure.
- This bill seeks to mimic Section 321-14.5, Hawaii Revised Statute (HRS) on hospital
- 5 licensing by allowing the Department to accept accreditation or certification of a skilled nursing
- 6 facility (SNF) by a nationally recognized accreditation or certification organization.
- 7 Organizations such as the Joint Commission accredit SNFs and the U.S. Centers for
- 8 Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) certifies SNFs. The Joint Commission's and CMS's
- 9 requirements are more stringent than Hawaii's administrative rules and are updated more
- 10 frequently as well.
- The Department's Office of Health Care Assurance (OHCA) conducts Medicare
- certification surveys, including initial certification, recertification, and federal complaint
- investigation surveys on behalf of CMS as authorized by the U.S. Social Security Act Section
- 14 1864 (1864 Agreement). CMS requires recertification surveys annually and OHCA conducts
- state license renewal surveys simultaneously with the CMS recertification surveys.

- With this bill the Department could accept accreditation surveys from a private
- 2 accreditation organization or use the CMS recertification survey for state licensing purposes.
- 3 This could allow OHCA to redeploy its staffing resources to other equally important surveys or
- 4 investigations especially during periods of limited staffing resources while maintaining oversight
- 5 of SNFs to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the public.
- The accreditation information or the CMS recertification survey report will be public
- 7 record and OHCA will post such information of its webpage of survey reports. OHCA has
- 8 posted the recent federal and state survey reports on the Yukio Okutsu State Veterans Home and
- 9 other federal reports on SNFs will be posted as well.
- Finally, the bill would continue to allow the Department to conduct state licensing
- surveys and complaint investigations.
