Bill Description: Provides that the prohibition against serving two consecutive terms not to exceed eight consecutive years pursuant to section 26-34(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall not apply to the representative of Hawaiian medium early learning providers' term limit. Repeals on June 30, 2025.

EXECUTIVE OFFICE ON EARLY LEARNING'S COMMENTS

Good afternoon. I am Lauren Moriguchi, Director of the Executive Office on Early Learning (EOEL). EOEL is providing comments on S.B. No. 1384 – relating to early learning.

EOEL is statutorily responsible for the development of the State's early childhood system that shall ensure a spectrum of high-quality development and learning opportunities for children throughout the state, from prenatal care until the time they enter kindergarten, with priority given to underserved or at-risk children. The Early Learning Board (ELB) was established as a governing board through Act 202, SLH 2017.

ELB is responsible for directing the EOEL on how best to meet the developmental and educational needs of children, from prenatal care to entry into kindergarten; providing recommendations to EOEL on improving the quality, availability, and coordination of early learning programs; promoting collaboration across agencies and stakeholders serving young children; and appoint the EOEL director and evaluating the director on an annual basis.

Recognizing the important role the ELB has in both representing the diverse field of early care and education in Hawaii and providing key insight and guidance to the EOEL, the ELB's perspective on this bill is of utmost importance.

The next ELB meeting is scheduled for Thursday February 11, 2021, in which this bill will be discussed. Following the meeting, EOEL will be able to provide more substantive comments regarding this bill, reflective of the needs expressed by ELB members.

THE ELB provides crucial input, direction, and oversight necessary for EOEL to achieve the statutory responsibilities of the Office. Representatives on the board are reflective of the diversity of the early care and education field in Hawaii, providing unique and important input on how to best serve Hawaii's families and young children. Hawaii is the only state in the United States that has designated a native language, Hawaiian, as one of its two official state languages. As such, the representative seat for Hawaiian medium early learning providers is a critical member and advocate for the important values of a Hawaiian medium early education.

Thank you for your consideration, and for the opportunity to testify on this bill. I am happy to answer any questions you may have.



SB1384 RELATING TO EDUCATION Ke Kōmike 'Aha Kenekoa o ka Ho'ona'auao

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The Administration of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) will recommend that the OHA Board of Trustees <u>SUPPORT</u> SB1384, which would faciliate the state's kuleana to 'Ōlelo Hawai'i by allowing for better, continued representation for Hawaiian medium early learning providers on the state's Early Learning Board (ELB). Because the perpetuation of 'Ōlelo Hawai'i is so important to the evolving culture, health, and wellbeing of Native Hawaiians, this measure is may be crucial to ensuring the continued use and growth of 'Ōlelo Hawai'i in Hawai'i and beyond.

Although our state is constitutionally mandated "to promote the study of Hawaiian culture, history, and language[,]" and 'Ōlelo Hawai'i has been an official state language since 1978,¹ much remains to be done to ensure the re-normalization of the Hawaiian language in the Hawaiian Islands. Ensuring that our early learning system and policies recognize the importance of 'Olelo Hawai'i immersion for Hawai'i's infants, toddlers, and preschoolers - which may also provide significant developmental benefits may be critical to this goal. Accordingly, it is critical to have continuous and consistent representation of Hawaiian medium early learning providers on the ELB. However, the ELB seat for a "representative of Hawaiian medium early learning providers," historically filled by the 'Aha Pūnana Leo, is currently limited only to two, 2-year consecutive terms.² Thus, the "Hawaiian medium early learning provider" representative may not serve more than a maximum of four consecutive years. This poses a significant challenge for a representative with the requisite experience and institutional knowledge to consistently fill this position, and has limited the ability of the 'APL representative from building the institutional knowledge and presence necessary to effectively advocate for the importance and value of a Hawaiian medium early education. Notably, this seat is currently empty and the ELB is suffering from the lack of 'APL's voice, which has otherwise consistently ensured that all ELB members understand and recognize the essential role of 'Ōlelo Hawai'i medium programming in the development and education of Hawai'i's growing keiki.

² HRS §302L-1.6(10) sets a two-year term for the representative of Hawaiian medium early learning providers; HRS § 26-34(a) provides that "[n]o person shall be appointed consecutively to more than two terms as a member of the same board or commission[.]"

By exempting the Hawaiian-medium representative from the general two-term limit inHRS § 26-34(a), SB1384 will enable a representative of Hawaiian medium early education to maintain a consistent Hawaiian voice on the ELB and help to fulfill the greater mission to perpetuate and normalize the state's official language of 'Ōlelo Hawai'i. The strength and endurance of 'Ōlelo Hawai'i is intrinsically connected to the health and wellbeing of the Native Hawaiian people, and it is part of what makes Hawai'i an authentic, unique, and beautiful place for all our local keiki to enjoy, learn, and ultimately thrive.

SB 1384 - RELATING TO EDUCATION

Chair Kidani, Vice Chair Kim, and members of the Senate Committee on Education:

Aloha e nā alaka'i o ka 'aha'ōlelo o Hawai'i nei,

Mahalo for the opportunity to submit testimony on SB 1384. The University of Hawai'i at Hilo (UH Hilo) supports the distinctive provisions of SB 1384 relating to the representation of Hawaiian language medium education on early education. UH Hilo is home to Ka Haka 'Ula o Ke'elikōlani, College of Hawaiian Language, who has been leading efforts to revitalize the Hawaiian language while also serving as a model to national and international indigenous communities who also seek to revive their endangered languages. With support from the Hawai'i State Legislature, UH Hilo/Ka Haka 'Ula has established a complete baccalaureate through to PhD program that offers high quality education to develop capacity for Hawaiian medium education and the further advancement of Hawaiian and indigenous languages writ large.

The distinctive provisions of SB1384 allow for consecutive terms for the representative of Hawaiian language medium early education. There is an extreme shortage of qualified individuals for all aspects of education through Hawaiian. This provision allows the state access to important contributions from the small pool of highly qualified individuals in this highly distinctive area of education of our state.

The introduction of SB 1384 indicates an awareness of the unique challenges of developing high quality education through Hawaiian in the state and leadership in addressing those challenges.

Early Learning Board Position: Comments

I am Robert G. Peters, Chair of the Early Learning Board (ELB). Thank you for this opportunity to offer comments on this bill, HB No. 2094, H.D. 1, on behalf of the Early Learning Board.

Through Act 202, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, ELB transitioned from an advisory to a governing board for the Executive Office on Early Learning (EOEL) and is charged with formulating statewide policy relating to early learning. We are composed of members from across the early childhood field, in both the public and private sectors. One of those members is the representative of the Hawaiian medium early learning providers. Hawaii has designated Hawaiian as one of its two official state languages. As such, and to insure the ELB reflects the diversity of the early learning community, the representative for Hawaiian medium early learning providers is a critical member and advocate for the important values of a Hawaiian medium early education.

SB 1384 was introduced following the January Early Learning Board meeting. As a result, ELB has not had a chance to discuss/vote on SB 1384 to date. At its January meeting, the Board supported the intent of the `Aha Punana Leo draft bill (HB 546). The sense of the Board was that the term limit currently in statute was a barrier to continuity of representation that the amended bill would address.

This bill for an act provides that the prohibition against serving two consecutive terms not to exceed eight consecutive years pursuant to section 26-34(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall not apply to the representative of Hawaiian medium early learning providers' term limit and repeals on June 30, 2025.

At its 61st annual convention, the Association adopted resolution 2020-34, supporting the proposed 2021 bill to uplift 'Aha Pūnana Leo's voice on the early learning board.
