SUBJECT: Testimony on S.B. No. 400, SD 1, HD 1, Relating to Campaign Finance Reports

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this bill.¹ The Campaign Spending Commission ("Commission") supports this bill.

As originally introduced, this measure amends HRS §11-340(c) to make clear that the increased fine (not to exceed \$300 per day) for the late-filing of preliminary reports only applies to the reports due ten days before a primary, general, or special election. This measure is necessary due to the additional preliminary report for candidate committees mandated by the Legislature in 2019. For reasons unknown to the Commission, GVR blanked out the ten days at lines 5, 7, 10, and 12 of the measure. The Commission urges this Committee to restore the language of the bill as originally introduced in the Senate and reinsert the ten days in the lines mentioned, with an effective date upon its approval.
