Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this bill.¹ The Campaign Spending Commission ("Commission") supports this bill, a house-keeping measure.

This measure amends subsection (a) of Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") §11-364 by including excess nonresident contributions to the list of prohibited contributions that committees must return to contributors within thirty days. Thereafter, if not returned, the excess nonresident contributions escheat to the Hawaii Election Campaign Fund. The Commission urges this Committee to pass this measure.
