# In consideration of SENATE BILL 762 RELATING TO STATE CAPITOL FACILTIES

Senate Bill 762 proposes to require the Department of Accounting and General Services (DAGS) to develop and implement an enhanced security plan for the State Capitol and surrounding grounds and amend provisions regarding the internal governance of the State Capitol Management Committee. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports this measure and offers comments.

Senate Bill 762 requires DAGS in consultation with the Legislature and any agencies responsible for security at the State Capitol and Washington Place, to develop and implement an enhanced security plan that: (1) enhances security at the State Capitol; and (2) ensures safety at the State Capitol while preserving public access.

SECTION 4 of Senate Bill 762 proposes to amend Section 6E-34.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to provide that the State Capitol Management Committee be co-chaired by a member of the House appointed by the Speaker and a member of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate. The Department supports these provisions.

Senate Bill 762 rightly acknowledges that the State Capitol building is a monument to our pride in our state government, and to the commitment to open access to the officials of that government. The State Capitol is listed in the National and Hawaii registers of historic places and is a central feature of the designated Hawaii Capitol historic district. Senate Bill 762 recognizes the importance of protecting the iconic character of the Capitol itself and as a contributing feature of the Hawaii Capitol Historic District. Given the historic significance of the State Capitol, the Department recommends that Senate Bill 762 be amended to by including the State Historic Preservation Officer or their designee, to the State Capitol Management Committee to ensure that preservation of the historic character of the State Capitol is fully considered during planning for the security upgrades at the State Capitol.
