SCR111 requests the Hawai'i Emergency Management Agency to convene a task force to study and identify appropriate stockpiles storage facility options to store and distribute emergency supplies in the State of Hawai'i.

As the COVID-19 virus has proven across the globe, local medical facilities can easily be overrun and their emergency resources depleted in times of pandemic or other natural or humancaused emergencies.
