In consideration of S.C.R. 247, S.D. 1 REQUESTING THAT A WORKING GROUP BE CONVENED TO DEVELOP RECOMMENDATIONS TO FACILITATE HOMESTEAD AGRICULTURAL DEMONSTRATION PROJECTS IN THE STATE.

HHFDC <u>offers the following comments</u> on S.C.R. 247, S.D. 1. HHFDC is generally willing to partner with its sister departments and agencies to facilitate housing development, including agricultural worker housing. However, we note that the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL), which would be responsible for convening the working group proposed in this Concurrent Resolution, previously testified that it does not have the resources to do so, and if given a choice between the two, prefers S.C.R. 246, S.D. 1 to this one. We further note that because the farm and ranch worker housing proposed in this Concurrent Resolution would be located on Hawaiian Home Lands, it would not be appropriate for HHFDC to be involved unless DHHL fully supports and requests our participation.
