Chairs Wakai and San Buenaventura, Vice Chairs Misalucha and Ihara, and members of the Committees.

The Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism (DBEDT) provides comments on SCR34/SR23, which requests that DBEDT, in coordination and cooperation with the County of Hawai'i Office of Aging complete a study regarding the necessity and feasibility of a senior living center to support the population of the Ka'u district and submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Legislature and the County of Hawai'i Office of the Mayor no later than July 1, 2021.

DBEDT would like to point out that the data availability, timing, and the limited resources of DBEDT make it difficult to complete the study as required by the resolution. First, the 2020 Decennial Census data would be the most recent and accurate data for the requested study; however, this data is not expected to be released until October 2021. Second, the allotted time-period for the study is only three months (from May to July 2021), and this does not allow enough time for a comprehensive study of this kind. Third, the feasibility portion of the study may include areas beyond economics such as environmental, traffic, and management that DBEDT does not have the required expertise in and does not have the resources to hire consultants to conduct the study.
