# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE COMPTROLLER.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the coronavirus 2 disease 2019 pandemic has required many state employees to work 3 from home or other remote locations to maintain social distancing and prevent the spread of the SARS-CoV-2 virus. 4 However, the relocation of state employees to non-traditional 5 6 work environments has left an indelible impression on the 7 possibilities of how state work can be accomplished. 8 The legislature has also determined that working from home 9 or other off-worksite locations has demonstrated the costeffectiveness and productivity of public services. Remote 10 teleworking can and should continue to remain an important 11

12 option for state employees who can accomplish their duties


13 outside of their traditional work environment. Social

14 distancing and decreasing employees' physical presence in state 15 facilities can continue to provide a defense against the spread 16 of infectious diseases as well as enable more cost-efficient use 17 of state office facilities.



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The legislature also finds that employees working off-site 1 2 enables the State to make better use of its limited resources, 3 including but not limited to office space, furnishing, equipment, electrical and data requirements, storage space, and 4 5 other traditional needs of employees who work at state 6 facilities. State facilities can also be adjusted and 7 consolidated to accommodate workers from various state agencies 8 at single locations. Employees who can accomplish the same work 9 from an off-site location may prefer to work at home to 10 accommodate the caregiving of keiki and kupuna. These 11 considerations can result in a win-win outcome for both 12 taxpayers and state employees. The purpose of this Act is to add, as part of the 13 14 comptroller's state facilities management responsibilities, the assessment and determination of office space requirements, 15 authorization of space allocation, and determination of telework 16 infrastructure requirements for tenants in buildings managed by 17 the department of accounting and general services. 18 SECTION 2. Chapter 40, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 19

20 by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately designated
21 and to read as follows:

2	occupying	space in facilities managed by the department of
3	accounting and general services or in non-state facilities, the	
4	comptroller shall:	
5	<u>(1)</u>	Assess and determine office space requirements;
6	(2)	Initiate or cancel leases upon the determination of
7		each agency's requirements;
8	(3)	Renegotiate existing leases;
9	(4)	Authorize office space allocation; and
10	(5)	Determine infrastructure requirements to allow
11		employees to telework.
12	(b)	The comptroller shall reduce the total square footage
13	of space leased by the State as of July 1, 2021, by ten per cent	
14	no later than July 1, 2026.	
15	(c) The comptroller shall submit a progress report on the	
16	implementation of this section to the legislature no later than	
17	twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session	
18	beginning in the regular session of 2022."	
19	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.	
20	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
