A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that under the State's
2	procurement code, an aggrieved party that submitted a bid for a
3	state project that was not awarded the bid may protest the bid
4	award. The legislature further finds that the procurement
5	protest review process can be lengthy, causing project delays,
6	thereby increasing project costs that are borne by taxpayers.
7	Thus, it is imperative that the review process for protests is
8	completed in a timely manner to reduce the cost of state
9	projects. Establishing a deadline for bid protests to be
10	reviewed and resolved would expedite the protest review process
11	and reduce costly delays on major construction contracts and
12	airport contracts.
13	The purpose of this Act is to:
14	(1) Demains the chief management offices on designed to

13	procurement officer or a designee shall [promptly] issue a
14	written decision [in writing] to uphold or deny the protest.
15	The decision shall:
16	(1) State the reasons for the action taken; and
17	(2) Inform the protestor of the protestor's right to an
18	administrative proceeding as provided in this part, if
19	applicable.
20	If the protest of a construction contract or airport contract
21	that is awarded pursuant to section 103D-302 or 103D-303 is not

2	designee shall issue a written decision to uphold or deny the	
3	protest within seventy-five calendar days of receipt of the	
4	protest; provided that the chief procurement officer or a	
5	designee may grant an extension based on written justification	<u>1</u>
6	of the extenuating circumstances; provided further that the	
7	extension shall not exceed forty-five calendar days."	
8	SECTION 3. Section 103D-709, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	3
9	amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:	
10	"(e) The party initiating a proceeding falling within	
11	subsection (d) shall pay to the department of commerce and	
12	consumer affairs a cash or protest bond in the amount of [+	
13	(1) \$1,000 for a contract with an estimated value of lea	38
14	than \$500,000;	
15	(2) \$2,000 for a contract with an estimated value of	
16	\$500,000 or more, but less than \$1,000,000; or	
17	(3) One half] one per cent of the estimated value of the	3

20	the required amount of the cash or protest bond be

- 8 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
