
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM
INCENTIVES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that consumption of fresh
2 fruits and vegetables is an integral part of a healthy diet and
3 central to the prevention of obesity and chronic disease. The
4 legislature also finds that every community should have access
5 to fresh and healthy dietary options, but the high cost of fresh
6 produce often makes that difficult. This challenge is felt
7 acutely by participants in the federal supplemental nutrition
8 assistance program, a low-income population that struggles to
9 afford healthy food.

10 The legislature also finds that the coronavirus disease
11 2019 pandemic has placed a financial strain on many local
12 families, including farmers, ranchers, and many involved in
13 Hawaii's agricultural industry. Multiple coronavirus disease
14 2019 restrictions and the drop in customer sales among retailers
15 and other businesses across the State have led to decreased



1 purchases from local farmers and ranchers, with some having to
2 consider scaling back operations or downsizing their workforce.

3 The legislature further finds that through the national
4 double up food bucks program, Hawaii has the opportunity to
5 expand access to healthy foods for low-income residents who are
6 eligible for supplemental nutrition assistance program benefits.
7 Currently implemented in more than twenty-eight states, the
8 double up food bucks program provides matching federal grant
9 moneys to state programs that incentivize the use of
10 supplemental nutrition assistance program benefits for the
11 purchase of fresh produce. Double up food bucks is a viable
12 model that supports local farmers, helps low-income families
13 that receive double the purchasing power for healthy, Hawaii-
14 grown produce, and benefits Hawaii by keeping dollars in the
15 local economy.

16 The enactment of Act 153, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019,
17 created the Hawaii healthy food incentive program, also known as
18 the double up food bucks program. The program provides a
19 dollar-for-dollar match to supplemental nutrition assistance
20 program beneficiaries who purchase locally-grown fruits and
21 vegetables at participating farmers' markets, grocery stores,



1 and community-supported agriculture projects. Funding from the
2 legislature has allowed community groups, led by the Food Basket
3 on Hawaii island, to obtain matching federal funds.
4 Additionally, local funders have also stepped up to amplify the
5 impact of this program, to ensure that it can reach communities
6 around the State.

7 The purpose of this Act is to expand the double up food
8 bucks program administered by the Hawaii department of
9 agriculture to make fresh fruits and vegetables sold at farmers'
10 markets and grocery stores accessible to families or individuals
11 who reside in this State and who receive assistance through the
12 federal supplemental nutrition assistance program.

13 SECTION 2. Section 141-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

15 "(b) Participants in the Hawaii healthy food incentive
16 program who are beneficiaries of the supplemental nutrition
17 assistance program shall receive a dollar-for-dollar match [~~of~~
18 ~~up to \$10 per visit, per day,~~] to be used exclusively for the
19 purchase of Hawaii-grown fresh fruits and vegetables, or healthy
20 proteins that are eligible for supplemental nutrition assistance
21 as determined by the program, at a farmers' market, farm stand,



1 mobile market, community-supported agriculture site, grocery
2 store, or other direct food retailer that participates in the
3 supplemental nutrition assistance program."

4 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,500,000 or so much
6 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2021-2022 and the
7 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
8 2022-2023 for administration of the Hawaii healthy food
9 incentive program and to provide matching funds to beneficiaries
10 who participate in the supplemental nutrition assistance
11 program; provided that any funds appropriated pursuant to this
12 section shall be included in the base budget of the department
13 of agriculture.

14 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
15 of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

16 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



Report Title:

HDOA; SNAP; Hawaii Healthy Food Incentive Program; Double Up Food Bucks Program; Appropriation

Description:

Removes the \$10 per visit per day cap on the dollar-for-dollar match received by Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program beneficiaries under the Hawaii Healthy Food Incentive Program, also known as the Double Up Food Bucks Program. Specifies that healthy proteins are eligible purchases under the program. Makes an appropriation to the Department of Agriculture to expand funding for the program.
