HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE WILLIAM S. RICHARDSON SCHOOL OF LAW TO ESTABLISH THE BURIAL SITES WORKING GROUP TO EXAMINE THE BURIAL SITES PROGRAM UNDER THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES' STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION DIVISION.

WHEREAS, the Hawaii State Constitution recognizes the value 1 of conserving and developing the historic and cultural property 2 within the State; and 3 4 WHEREAS, according to section 6E-1, Hawaii Revised 5 Statutes, the historic and cultural heritage of the State is 6 among its most important assets and that the rapid social and 7 economic developments of contemporary society threaten to 8 destroy the remaining vestiges of this heritage; and 9 10 WHEREAS, section 6E-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, provides 11 that it is in the public's interest to engage in a comprehensive 12 program of historic preservation at all levels of government to 13 promote the use and conservation of such property for the 14 education, inspiration, pleasure, and enrichment of its 15 citizens; and 16 17 WHEREAS, section 6E-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, sets forth 18 that the State must provide leadership in preserving, restoring, 19 and maintaining historic and cultural property to ensure the 20 administration of historic and cultural property in a spirit of 21 stewardship and trusteeship for future generations, and to 22 conduct activities, plans, and programs in a manner consistent 23 with the preservation and enhancement of historic and cultural 24 property; and 25 26 WHEREAS, native Hawaiian traditional prehistoric and 27 unmarked burials are especially vulnerable and often not 28 afforded adequate protection of law, which assures dignity and 29 freedom from unnecessary disturbance; and 30 31



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1 WHEREAS, the Island Burial Councils were created by Act 2 306, Session Laws of Hawaii 1990 (Act 306), to further its 3 purpose of augmenting current procedures relating to the proper 4 care and protection of burial sites found in the State, avoid 5 future disputes arising from the discovery of human skeletal 6 remains, and provide additional protection for native Hawaiian 7 burial sites of high preservation value; and

9 WHEREAS, the Department of Land and Natural Resources' 10 State Historic Preservation Division serves to protect and 11 preserve historic properties significant to Hawaii's history 12 through several program areas; and

14 WHEREAS, audits of the State Historic Preservation Division 15 have reported serious internal strife and a significant backlog 16 of project reviews, resulting in the undermining of the 17 preservation and protection of unmarked burial sites throughout 18 the islands; and

20 WHEREAS, on January 19, 2021, the chairpersons of the 21 burial councils for the islands of Oahu, Maui/Lanai, and Hawaii 22 coordinated an islands-wide protest to raise awareness of their 23 collective duties and responsibilities to protect Hawaiian 24 burial sites and care for iwi kupuna (ancestral bones) and moepu 25 (funerary possessions); and

WHEREAS, the chairpersons of the Island Burial Councils 27 asserted that systemic and chronic mismanagement of the burial 28 councils by the Department of Land and Natural Resources' State 29 Historic Preservation Division has effectively undermined the 30 ability of the Island Burial Councils to exercise their legally 31 32 established authorities, rights, and responsibilities, resulting in the inability to provide protection and cultural care to 33 unmarked Hawaiian burial sites in accordance with the program 34 enacted by Act 306; and 35

WHEREAS, the chairpersons of the Island Burial Councils
cited examples of the State Historic Preservation Division's
mismanagement of the Island Burial Councils and Burial Sites
program, including the failure to:



Adequately staff the Island Burial Councils and manage (1) 1 2 the terms of council members; 3 Provide training to State historic preservation staff 4 (2) and burial council members regarding the burial law 5 and administrative rules, Sunshine Law, and Code of 6 7 Ethics; 8 Require the Department of the Attorney General to 9 (3) ensure independent legal representation of the island 10 burial councils; 11 12 Implement administrative rules to develop the burial 13 (4) sites inventory; 14 15 Provide proper administrative support to the island 16 (5) burial councils, including timely actions, decisions, 17 and recommendations regarding the preparation of 18 agenda items, and providing the councils proper 19 quidance on the processes involving burial matters; 20 21 Comply with legal requirements applicable to the (6) 22 inadvertent discovery of human remains; and 23 24 (7) Undertake enforcement actions of documented statutory 25 and regulatory violations involving burial sites; 26 27 now, therefore, 28 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 30 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 31 32 of 2021, the Senate concurring, that the William S. Richardson School of Law is requested to form the Burial Sites Working 33 34 Group to provide formal recommendations on how to correct the 35 mismanagement by the Department of Land and Natural Resources' State Historic Preservation Division; and 36 37 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and Natural Resources' State Historic Preservation Division is 39 40 requested to cooperate with the Burial Sites Working Group; and 41



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Burial Sites Working Group 1 is urged to include the chairpersons of all Island Burial 2 Councils; Administrator of the Department of Land and Natural 3 Resources' State Historic Preservation Division; History and 4 Culture Branch Chief of the Department of Land and Natural 5 Resources' State Historic Preservation Division; Department of 6 7 Land and Natural Resources' State Historic Preservation Division Burials Specialist; a representative of the Office of Hawaiian 8 Affairs; two representatives of large landowners and developers 9 10 to be appointed by the Governor; a representative of the Hawaiian community familiar with and experienced with the Burial 11 Sites Program to be appointed by the Office of Hawaiian Affairs; 12 and a representative of Huliauapa'a/Kali'uokapa'akai Collective to 13 be selected by that organization; and 14 15

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Burial Sites Working Group is requested to submit a report detailing the formal findings and recommendations for corrective action, including proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2022; and 21

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 23 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, 24 Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, 25 Chairperson of the Board of Trustees of the Office of Hawaiian 26 Affairs, Chairperson of each Island Burial Council, Dean of the 27 William S. Richardson School of Law, and President of the 28 Huliauapa'a/Kali'uokapa'akai Collective.

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
