

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON BUSINESS LIABILITY PROTECTIONS RELATED TO COVID-19-RELATED CLAIMS.

WHEREAS, the virus known as SARS-CoV-2 is responsible for 1 2 the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic that has severely crippled the nation's and State's public health and 3 4 economy; and 5 WHEREAS, emergency proclamations and orders by the Governor 6 and county mayors to prevent the spread of COVID-19 include 7 safety measures and restrictions to prevent and mitigate the 8 spread of the virus, which have allowed certain businesses to 9 10 continue to remain open or reopen; and 11 WHEREAS, businesses open to provide services to the public 12 during the pandemic face significant risk, including the risk of 13 civil liability, which threatens the State's ongoing economic 14 15 recovery efforts; and 16 WHEREAS, according to the American Bar Association, there 17 is national debate over the need for business liability 18 protection from COVID-19-related lawsuits; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, according to the American Bar Association, business owners are concerned about the prospect of employees or 22 23 customers contracting COVID-19 while on business premises and how that could translate into liability lawsuits; and 24 25 WHEREAS, some businesses are considering requiring their 26 customers to sign a COVID-19 liability waiver to hold the 27 business harmless if the customer contracts COVID-19 while on 28 business premises; and 29

WHEREAS, in addition, federal and state lawmakers are 1 considering protective legislation for COVID-19-related claims 2 and business liability protection legislation is before Congress 3 and some state legislatures; and 4 5 WHEREAS, despite potential legislation, the current 6 COVID-19 legal landscape and options related to liability 7 protections for businesses remain unclear; now, therefore, 8 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 10 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 11 of 2021, the Senate concurring, that the Legislative Reference 12 Bureau is requested to conduct a study on business liability 13 protections related to COVID-19-related claims; and 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study include: 16 17 Surveying modifications enacted by the federal 18 (1) government and other states to business liability 19 protections and workplace safety guidance and 20 directors in response to COVID-19; and 21 22 Comparing existing Hawaii laws relating to business (2) 23 24 liability protections and workplace safety guidance and directives with similar federal and state laws; 25 and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference 28 Bureau is requested to submit the study, including findings, 29 recommendations, and any proposed legislation, to the 30 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 31 32 the Regular Session of 2022; and 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 34 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the 35 Legislative Reference Bureau, President and Chief Executive 36 37 Officer of The Chamber of Commerce Hawaii, and President of the Retail Merchants of Hawaii. 38
