HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE UNITED STATES FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION TO PROMOTE TRANSPARENCY AND ENFORCEMENT BY PROVIDING INDIVIDUAL PREMARKET TOBACCO PRODUCT APPLICATION APPLICANT INFORMATION OF HAWAII SELLERS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT PURPOSES.

1 WHEREAS, according to a 2020 joint study by the United 2 States Food and Drug Administration and Centers for Disease 3 Control and Prevention (CDC), there are an estimated 3,600,000 4 youth who currently use e-cigarettes, or electronic nicotine 5 delivery systems (ENDS); and

7 WHEREAS, according to the Hawaii Youth Risk Survey,
8 commissioned by the Department of Health, Hawaii high school
9 students are twice as likely as youth nationally to vape; and
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11 WHEREAS, the 2017 Hawaii Youth Tobacco Survey found that 12 Hawaii has the highest rate of e-cigarette use among middle 13 school students and the second highest rate among high school 14 students in the United States; and

16 WHEREAS, the marketing of e-cigarettes and ENDS products 17 aggressively targets vulnerable youth users with the 18 introduction of flavored e-cigarettes and ENDS products, as well 19 as advertisements in social media employing celebrities and 20 influencers, which ultimately promote the illegal sale and use of 21 e-cigarettes and ENDS products by underage users; and

WHEREAS, the United States Surgeon General, United States
Department of Health and Human Services, and CDC warns that the
use of e-cigarettes and ENDS products are unsafe due to the
highly addictive nature of nicotine, harm to the developing
adolescent brain, carcinogens and other toxins present in the

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aerosol inhaled, and potentially lethal toxins if the content of 1 2 refill cartridges are consumed; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the passage of the Consolidated Appropriations 5 Act, 2021, in December 2020 amended the Jenkins Act, as previously amended by the Prevent All Cigarette Trafficking Act, 6 7 to mandate that any delivery sale of ENDS will require an adult's signature upon delivery, ostensibly increasing the 8 9 difficulty for minors to illegally obtain ENDS; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the Food and Drug Administration required any 12 seller and manufacturer of new tobacco products, including e-cigarettes and ENDS products, to submit a Premarket Tobacco 13 Product Application (PTPA) by September 9, 2020; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, the Food and Drug Administration has seen an influx of PTPAs with receipt of 14,751 applications in August 17 18 and September 2019 alone; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the identities of Hawaii sellers of e-cigarettes 21 and ENDS products who have pending or approved PTPAs in 22 compliance with the Food and Drug Administration requirements are currently unknown for enforcement purposes; now, therefore, 23 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 26 27 of 2021, the Senate concurring, that the United States Food and Drug Administration is requested to promote transparency and 28 29 enforcement by immediately providing individual Premarket 30 Tobacco Product Application applicant information of Hawaii 31 sellers to the Department of the Attorney General for law enforcement purposes; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of the Attorney 34 General is urged to identify those Hawaii sellers who do not 35 have a pending or approved Premarket Tobacco Product Application 36 37 in compliance with the United States Food and Drug 38 Administration requirements and transmit such information to the 39 United States Food and Drug Administration for enforcement 40 purposes; and

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of the Attorney General is requested to submit a comprehensive report of actions taken pursuant to this measure to the Legislature no later than sixty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2022; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Commissioner of the
United States Food and Drug Administration, Director of the
Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Governor, Attorney
General, and Director of Health.
