## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

6	(12)	Sue and be sued in the name of the "State of Hawaii"
7	(13)	Exercise incidental powers as are deemed necessary or
8		requisite to fulfill its duty in carrying out the
9		purposes of this chapter;
10	(14)	Delegate authority to its chairperson to approve
11		loans, where the requested amount plus any principal
12		balance on existing loans to the applicant, does not
13		exceed $[\$25,000]$ $\$50,000$ of state funds; and
14	(15)	Adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 necessary for the
15		purpose of this chapter."

## Report Title:

Department of Agriculture; Agricultural Loan Program; Aquaculture Loan Program

## Description:

Amends the maximum amount that the Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture is authorized to approve for agricultural loans and aquacultural loans not to exceed \$50,000 of state funds, rather than \$25,000. (CD1)

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
