A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRONIC TRANSMISSION OF BALLOTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 11-107, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[+] §11-107[+] Electronic transmission under certain
- 4 circumstances. (a) If a ballot package is not received by a
- 5 voter by the fifth day before the date of the election or a
- 6 voter otherwise requires a replacement ballot within five days
- 7 of an election, the voter may request that a ballot be forwarded
- 8 by electronic transmission[; provided that a voter with special
- 9 needs may request that a ballot be forwarded by electronic
- 10 transmission at any time]. Upon receipt of such a request and
- 11 confirmation that proper application was made, the clerk may
- 12 transmit the appropriate ballot, together with a form containing
- 13 the affirmations, information, and a waiver of the right to
- 14 secrecy under section 11-137.
- 15 (b) The voter may return the completed replacement ballot
- 16 and executed forms:

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1	(1)	by electionic cransmission so that the completed
2		replacement ballot and executed forms are received at
3		the office of the clerk no later than the closing time
4		provided in section 11-131 on the date of the
5		election;
6	(2)	By mail so that the completed replacement ballot and
7		executed forms are received at the office of the clerk
8		no later than the closing time provided in section 11-
9		131 on the date of the election;
10	(3)	By personal delivery to any place of deposit no later
11		than 7:00 p.m. on the date of the election; provided
12		that any voter who is standing in line at a place of
13		deposit at 7:00 p.m. on the date of the election with
14		the intent of returning a ballot and casting a vote
15		shall be allowed to vote; or
16	(4)	By personal delivery to a voter service center no
17		later than the closing time provided in section 11-131
18		on the date of the election; provided that any voter

who is standing in line at a voter service center at

the closing time provided in section 11-131 on the

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Ţ	date of the election with the intent of returning a
2	ballot and casting a vote shall be allowed to vote.
3	(c) A voter with special needs may request that a ballot
4	be forwarded by electronic transmission at any time. Upon
5	receipt of such a request and confirmation that proper
6	application was made, the clerk may transmit the appropriate
7	ballot, together with a form containing the affirmations and
8	information. The voter with special needs may return the
9	completed ballot and executed forms by any of the methods
10	specified in subsection (b).
11	$[\frac{(c)}{(c)}]$ (d) Upon receipt, the clerk shall verify compliance
12	with the requirements of this part; provided that if the voter
13	returns multiple voted ballots for the same election, the clerk
14	shall prepare only the first ballot returned that is not
15	spoiled."
16	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
17	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
18	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on May 1, 2029.
