
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DECEPTIVE TRADE PRACTICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii residents are
2 often barred from claiming offers for free or reduced rate
3 shipping, which are more commonly available to purchasers in
4 other states. Many retailers also apply an arbitrary shipping
5 cost to Hawaii residents, which does not correlate with the
6 actual cost of shipping.

7 The purpose of this Act is to establish that charging
8 shipping and delivery charges that exceed the actual cost to
9 ship or deliver a commodity to a consumer in the State shall
10 constitute an unfair and deceptive practice.

11 SECTION 2. Chapter 481B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
13 and to read as follows:

14 "§481B- Shipping charges. In the sale or purchase of
15 any commodity to be shipped or delivered to a consumer in the
16 State, if a separate charge for shipping or delivery is charged



1 to a consumer, that charge shall not exceed the actual cost to
2 ship or deliver the commodity to a consumer in the State."

3 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

4 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.
