
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DRIVER'S LICENSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 286-106, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "**§286-106 Expiration of licenses.** Every driver's license
4 issued under this part, except for a provisional license issued
5 under section 286-102.6 which shall expire on the date of the
6 provisional licensee's nineteenth birthday, whether an original
7 issuance or a renewal, shall expire on the first birthday of the
8 licensee occurring not less than eight years after the date of
9 the issuance of the license, unless sooner revoked or suspended;
10 provided that:

11 (1) The license shall expire on the first birthday of the
12 licensee occurring not less than four years after the
13 date of the issuance if, at the time, the licensee is
14 ~~[twenty-four]~~ :

15 (A) Twenty-four years of age or younger; or

16 (B) Seventy-two years of age or older but younger

17 than eighty years of age; provided further that



1 the licensee's driving record does not include
 2 two or more convictions of a moving traffic
 3 violation after the licensee attained the age of
 4 seventy-two years;

5 (2) The license shall expire on the first birthday of the
 6 licensee occurring not less than two years after the
 7 date of the issuance of the license if, at that time,
 8 the licensee is [~~seventy-two~~]:

9 (A) Seventy-two years of age or older[+] but younger
 10 than eighty years of age, and the licensee's
 11 driving record includes two or more convictions
 12 of a moving traffic violation after the licensee
 13 turned seventy-two years of age; or

14 (B) Eighty years of age or older; and

15 (3) If the licensee is a legal immigrant, the license
 16 shall expire no later than the licensee's authorized
 17 period of stay in the United States.

18 The examiner of drivers may issue a license for a shorter
 19 period if the licensee has a physical condition or conditions
 20 that the examiner of drivers reasonably believes may impair the
 21 driver's ability to drive.



1 As used in this section, "moving traffic violation" shall
2 mean a violation of a statute, ordinance, or rule relating to
3 traffic movement and control arising from the operation of a
4 motor vehicle, including a commercial motor vehicle."

5 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

7 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.

Driver's License; Expiration and Renewal; Kupuna

Description:

Extends the renewal period from two years to four years for licensees who are seventy-two years of age or older but younger than eighty years of age; provided their driving record does not include two or more moving traffic violation convictions after the licensee attained the age of seventy-two years. Defines moving traffic violation. Takes effect 1/1/2050. (SD1)
