SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO EXPLORE WAYS IT CAN EXERCISE OVERSIGHT OVER COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTERS AND OTHER MEDICAL SERVICE ENTITIES WHEN A DANGER TO THE COMMUNITY'S HEALTH EXISTS.

1 WHEREAS, Article IX, section 9 of the Hawaii State Constitution requires the State to "provide for the protection 2 3 and promotion of the public health"; and 4 WHEREAS, community health centers, also known as federally 5 6 qualified health centers, are the cornerstone of Hawaii's health care system and provide essential services to the State's most 7 vulnerable populations; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, because community health centers often serve federally recognized areas where residents face barriers to 11 getting health care, the State must ensure that these centers 12 provide proficient medical services to its residents; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, recent events have demonstrated the importance of ensuring that community health centers and other medical service 16 17 entities are properly staffed and skillfully managed; and 18 WHEREAS, the current coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic has 19 shown how vulnerable our communities are to a worldwide public 20 health catastrophe; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, community health centers provide critical health care services and must have the necessary resources to handle 24 25 such public health emergencies; and 26 WHEREAS, in 2019, the only community health center on the 27 28 island of Molokai closed for four days in August due to staff

1 shortages; specifically, the center did not have a physician on 2 staff, in violation of federal requirements; and 3 WHEREAS, the closure of the clinic put at risk the health 4 and safety of Molokai residents who were unable to see a doctor 5 or obtain crucial medication; and 6 7 WHEREAS, although state officials attempted to investigate 8 9 the center following the closure, the health center refused to cooperate with the investigation; and 10 11 WHEREAS, other types of medical service entities have also 12 experienced disturbing incidents, including a high-profile event 13 14 involving the death of a child at a Kailua dental practice; and 15 WHEREAS, given these past events and the Hawaii State 16 17 Constitution's mandate that the State provide for the protection and promotion of the public health, it is incumbent upon the 18 19 State to study ways to ensure that community health centers and 20 other medical service entities are providing proficient services to the communities they serve; now, therefore, 21 22 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 24 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 25 Health is requested to conduct a study that explores options for 26 it to provide better oversight over community health centers, 27 dental clinics, and other medical service entities; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study is requested to 30 31 include: 32 A recommendation regarding additional authority that 33 (1) will enable the Department of Health to adequately 34 oversee community health centers, dental clinics, and 35 other medical service entities; 36 37 An overview of other jurisdictions that oversee these (2) 38 types of medical service entities, and how those 39 jurisdictions provide oversight; 40 41
