SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO EXAMINE AND ASSESS ITS ARRANGEMENT FOR SERVICES WITH THE RESEARCH CORPORATION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii is established as the 1 2 state university and a body corporate pursuant to the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and state law and is 3 currently the sole provider of public higher education for the 4 5 State; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the Research Corporation of the University of 8 Hawaii (RCUH) is a body corporate established pursuant to section 304A-3001, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as a public 9 10 instrumentality of the State that is a part of the University of Hawaii for administrative purposes; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, the mission of the RCUH is to support and enhance research, development, and training in Hawaii, with a focus on 14 15 the University of Hawaii; and 16 WHEREAS, to carry out its purposes and objectives, the RCUH 17 is granted flexibility in the hiring of its personnel and in the 18 handling and disbursement of monies, by being exempted from 19 20 certain state laws, including: 21 22 (1) Obligations to reimburse the state general fund for central service and administrative expenses under 23 sections 36-27 and 36-30, Hawaii Revised Statutes; 24 25 26 (2) Chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Hawaii Public Procurement Code, relating to the advertisement 27 for bids and purchases to be made in Hawaii whenever 28 29 public monies are expended;

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The Hawaii Public Procurement Code with respect to 1 (3) construction contracts; provided that the exemption 2 does not apply where state funds are used and 3 compliance with the code is required by a bill enacted 4 5 by the Legislature; 6 7 (4) Chapter 76, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Civil Service 8 Law; 9 Section 78-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, relating to 10 (5) 11 public employment; and 12 Laws relating to collective bargaining in public 13 (6) 14 employment under chapter 89, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 15 with regard to services provided to the University of 16 Hawaii pursuant to section 304A-112, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, the RCUH has utilized its exemptions from the Hawaii Public Procurement Code as a pass-through for various 20 projects, including the construction of the University of Hawaii 21 22 West Oahu campus; and 23 WHEREAS, under section 304A-112, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 24 25 when the University of Hawaii determines that neither the University nor another state agency can more effectively or 26 efficiently accomplish the purposes of sponsored research and 27 training activities, the University must contract with the RCUH 28 29 to receive management and other services to support such research and training activities; and 30 31 WHEREAS, the support services provided by the RCUH to the 32 33 University of Hawaii pursuant to section 304A-112, Hawaii Revised Statutes, may include procurement of goods and services, 34 35 employment of personnel, and provision of advance funding for 36 research and training contracts and grants; and 37 38 WHEREAS, when the University of Hawaii contracts out 39 sponsored research and training activities to the RCUH, the University retains portions of the extramural funds and grants 40 41 it receives, as internal costs computed by using internal cost 42 rates; and

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1 WHEREAS, the terms and conditions of the services provided 2 by the RCUH to the University of Hawaii, including the factors and method by which fees charged by the RCUH are computed, are 3 4 set forth in a service agreement between the two parties; and 5 6 WHEREAS, concerns have been raised over the transparency of the RCUH's operations and its handling of expenses, as well as 7 the increasing amount of fees it charges and collects from the 8 9 University of Hawaii; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii and RCUH are public corporations, and therefore, their board members and officers 12 occupy fiduciary positions under which they owe duties of care 13 and loyalty to their respective entities; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, section 6 of article X of the Hawaii State 17 Constitution, which grants the Board of Regents of the 18 University of Hawaii exclusive jurisdiction over the internal 19 structure, management, and operation of the University, 20 specifically provides that the power of the Legislature to enact laws of statewide concern shall not be limited and that the 21 Legislature shall have the exclusive jurisdiction to identify 22 laws of statewide concern; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, it is a matter of statewide concern to ensure that 26 the fees committed and paid by the University of Hawaii to the RCUH for its support services are reasonable and commensurate 27 28 with, and balanced against, the needs, priorities, and other 29 demands placed on the University's limited resources; and 30 31 WHEREAS, it would benefit the State to have the terms and conditions of the service agreement between the University of 32 Hawaii and RCUH examined and assessed, considering the 33 34 University's existing research needs, research priorities, 35 limited resources, anticipated opportunities for extramural sponsored research, the State's current economic and financial 36 37 situation due to the disruptions caused by the coronavirus 38 disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, and predicted increase in fees 39 charged by the RCUH; now, therefore, 40
