## SENATE RESOLUTION

DECLARING A CLIMATE EMERGENCY AND REQUESTING STATEWIDE COLLABORATION TOWARD AN IMMEDIATE JUST TRANSITION AND EMERGENCY MOBILIZATION EFFORT TO RESTORE A SAFE CLIMATE.

WHEREAS, global warming has now raised the average global 1 air temperature about one degree Celsius, and scientists have 2 documented that this extra heat is already having a dramatic 3 4 impact on the environment, as demonstrated through larger and stronger hurricanes, increased drought and flooding, shifting 5 rain patterns, more and larger wildfires, a hotter and more 6 acidic ocean, and damaged ecosystems, both marine and 7 terrestrial, across the planet; and 8

WHEREAS, in April 2016, world leaders recognized the urgent need to combat climate change by signing the Paris Agreement, agreeing to keep global warming "well below 2°C (3.6°F) above pre-industrial levels" and to "pursue efforts to limit the temperature increase to 1.5°C (2.7°F)"; and

16 WHEREAS, in 2017, over fifteen thousand scientists
17 published a "Warning to Humanity", declaring that greenhouse
18 gases produced from human activities have "pushed Earth's
19 ecosystems to their breaking point"; and

21 WHEREAS, 13,784 scientists from one hundred fifty-six 22 countries have signed a declaration, unequivocally affirming 23 that "planet Earth is facing a climate emergency" and it will 24 now take "an immense increase of scale in endeavors to conserve 25 our biosphere" to avoid untold suffering; and

WHEREAS, in the absence of action to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, reports indicate that warming is likely to accelerate in the next decade and reach 1.5 degrees Celsius by 2030 - ten years earlier than projected by the 2014 Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), and two degrees Celsius by 2045; and

WHEREAS, based upon the scientific information and 1 2 expertise available, Hawaii remains particularly vulnerable to the dangers of disaster occurrences as a result of the effects 3 of global warming, thereby endangering the health, safety, and 4 welfare of the people, warranting preemptive and protective 5 6 action; and 7 8 WHEREAS, the Hawaii State Constitution adopts the public 9 trust doctrine for the benefit of the people and the right of 10 each person to a clean and healthful environment; and 11 WHEREAS, as of January 26, 2021, 1,864 jurisdictions in 12 13 thirty-three countries have already declared a climate 14 emergency; now, therefore, 15 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 16 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, 17 that this body acknowledges that an existential climate 18 emergency threatens humanity and the natural world, declares a 19 climate emergency, and requests statewide collaboration toward 20 21 an immediate just transition and emergency mobilization effort to restore a safe climate; and 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that entities statewide are 24 requested to pursue these climate mitigation and adaptation 25 26 efforts and mobilize at the necessary scale and speed: 27 28 (1) A statewide commitment to a just transition toward a decarbonized economy that invests in and ensures clean 29 30 energy, quality jobs, and a statewide commitment to a climate emergency mobilization effort to reverse the 31 climate crisis, which, with appropriate financial and 32 regulatory assistance from state authorities, will 33 transform the economy at emergency speed to zero 34 emissions and meet the emission targets as set forth 35 by the IPCC report to limit warming to 1.5 degrees 36 Celsius; 37 38 (2) A prohibition against any further public or private 39 investment or subsidies in projects that will make the 40 climate emergency worse, such as coal, oil, gas, and 41 tree-burning projects, and redirecting and channeling 42

subsidies toward low climate impact energy projects 1 2 and workforce retraining; 3 (3) Facilitation of investments in beneficial projects and 4 infrastructure such as zero emissions energy; electric 5 vehicles, including clean fleet transitions for the 6 7 State and counties; energy efficiency; reforestation; afforestation; climate-smart agriculture; and climate-8 9 friendly land use; and 10 (4) Organization and tracking of a time-phased 11 implementation plan that assigns state government 12 13 agencies' responsibilities and timetables; establishment of task dependencies between departments 14 with a priority to plan and coordinate, at a statewide 15 level, all climate and resilience responses, including 16 emergency mitigation of climate change effects, 17 resilience, adaptation, engagement, education, 18 advocacy, and research and development programs, all 19 of which begin with a robust climate emergency public 20 21 education and stakeholder outreach process; and requirements of all departmental reports that utilize 22 a lifecycle greenhouse gas analysis to include a 23 climate impacts section, which will provide meaningful 24 information on how proposed actions will impact 25 26 greenhouse gas reduction efforts; and 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that public and private entities are 28 urged to commit to statewide action that is rooted in equity, 29 self-determination, culture, tradition, and the belief that 30 people locally and around the world have the right to clean, 31 healthy, and adequate air, water, land, food, education, and 32 33 shelter; and 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that nothing in this measure 35 constitutes a declaration of an emergency for purposes of any 36 act authorizing the exercise of any special or extraordinary 37 power during the period of a state emergency or other type of 38 declared emergency; and 39 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 41 42 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; Attorney General;
