SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS TO OPEN EMPLOYMENT OFFICES IN ALL COUNTIES; INCREASE THE HANDLING CAPACITY FOR UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFIT CLAIMS BY THIRTY PERCENT; COMPLETE THE UPGRADING OF ITS UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFIT CLAIMS COMPUTER SYSTEM; AND WORK WITH THE BOARD OF EDUCATION AND THE STATE LIBRARIAN TO ADOPT POLICIES AND NEEDED TRAINING TO ENSURE THAT MINIMAL ASSISTANCE IS PROVIDED TO PERSONS WISHING TO USE PUBLIC ACCESS COMPUTERS AT ANY STATE LIBRARY TO FILE UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFIT CLAIMS.

WHEREAS, the disruptions caused by the coronavirus disease 1 2019 pandemic resulted in many Hawaii workers losing their jobs 2 and an unprecedented number of unemployment benefit claims; and 3 4 WHEREAS, many state employment offices, as defined in 5 6 section 383-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, that assist unemployed workers are closed for in-person assistance thus requiring 7 unemployed workers to seek information, create on-line accounts, 8 file unemployment benefit claims and weekly claim 9 certifications, submit information, and make inquiries solely 10 through online web-based options; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, the Legislature allocated \$10,000,000 to the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations for the purpose of 14 upgrading and modernizing the Department's computer technology 15 for its unemployment benefit claims system; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, the lack of in-person assistance is hindering the 19 unemployed workers from receiving the required assistance or benefits they may be entitled to, as many of them lack basic 20 computer skills and ready access to the internet, and are not 21 22 proficient in speaking, reading, or writing the English 23 language; now, therefore, 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, 26 27 that the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations is 28 requested to open for in-person assistance, at least one employment office in each of the counties of Hawaii, Kauai, and 29



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Maui, and at least two employment offices on the island of Oahu 1 to be located in Waipahu and Honolulu; and 2 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Labor and 4 Industrial Relations is requested to hire, assign, or reassign 5 staff as necessary to increase the handling capacity for 6 unemployment benefit claims by thirty percent; and 7 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Labor and 9 Industrial Relations is requested to complete the upgrading and 10 modernization of its unemployment benefit claims computer 11 system; and 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education and the 14 State Librarian are requested to cooperate with the Department 15 of Labor and Industrial Relations to adopt policies and training 16 as needed, to ensure that all state public library staff can 17 provide minimal assistance to any person wishing to use public 18 access computers at any state library to file the person's 19 unemployment benefit claim and certifications; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all public access computers at 22 state libraries are requested to have the Department of Labor 23 and Industrial Relations Unemployment Insurance Claimant 24 Services webpage bookmarked on all web browsers, and to the 25 extent possible, at least one public access computer in each 26 state public library shall be reserved for persons wishing to 27 file a claim for unemployment benefits; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the above requests are 30 requested to be completed within thirty days of the receipt of 31 this resolution; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 34 35 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Labor and Industrial Relations, State Librarian, Mayor of the County of 36 Hawaii, Mayor of the County of Maui, Mayor of the County of 37 Kauai, and Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu. 38 39 40 - Acasin 41 OFFERED BY:
