It was founded to support the servicemen and women who serve in the Hawaii National Guard, their families, and the community and to support the modernization of equipment, and maintain and/or increase our personnel benefits for Soldiers, Airmen, and their families.

NATIONAL GUARD CONFERENCE CORPORATION OF HAWAII, INC. conducts conferences, social events, and community activities. It operates a community center facilitating its outreach to the wider community and strengthening the relationship of the National Guard, its servicemembers and their families, with the broader community to include, but not limited to, the Navy, Marines and Coast Guard.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request.

The NATIONAL GUARD CONFERENCE CORPORATION OF HAWAII, INC will serve as the operator of an events facility which strengthens and supports the community as an activity center. Due to the dislocation of the NATIONAL GUARD CONFERENCE CORPORATION OF HAWAII, INC. co-partner, it is confronted with the prospect of shuttering its doors. These funds will enable NATIONAL GUARD CONFERENCE CORPORATION OF HAWAII, INC. to repair the facility roof, install air conditioning, and install solar panels to reduce energy costs and increase energy efficiency.

The public purpose and need to be served:

The NATIONAL GUARD CONFERENCE CORPORATION OF HAWAII, INC. community events facility will be available to the public with priority to serve the events and activities of the Hawaii National Guard Soldiers, Airmen, and their families, and the broader public community. This grant will enable the NATIONAL GUARD CONFERENCE CORPORATION OF HAWAII, INC. to serve the community through a community-driven process that engages Soldiers, Airmen, their families, and the community members in identifying and facilitating events that bring people together. NATIONAL GUARD CONFERENCE CORPORATION OF HAWAII, INC. community events facility focuses on the powerful principles of involving everyone, focusing on what matters most to the community, and playing the long game—it helps the community move toward a more cohesive future by bringing residents closer together.

Isolation can be one of the most heart-wrenching emotions a person can experience, exacerbated by over two years of the pandemic. For Hawaii National Guard servicemembers and their families it can sometimes seem hard to build relationships with others due to different backgrounds, among many other factors. A sense of belonging to a community has many benefits, not only for the individuals in the community but Hawaii as a state. Strengthening the relationships between the Hawaii National Guard and the community promotes positive outcomes for the state of Hawai'i.

3. Describe the target population to be served:

The target population includes Hawaii National Guard Soldiers, Airmen, and their families, and the broader public community to include but not limited to, the Navy, Marines, and Coast Guard. This request will facilitate a transition period so that NATIONAL GUARD CONFERENCE CORPORATION OF HAWAII, INC. can operate a community center located in the Airport/Moanalua area of 'Oahu.


