- 2. The goals and objectives related to the request;
  This grant would be used for demolition and clearing of an approximately
  3-acre site on the grounds of the Liliha Campus. Funds may also be used for initial planning and design to create a living facility for those who need
  24 hour, seven day a week medical care.
- The public purpose and need to be served;
  The proportion of Hawaii's population that is over 60 is growing much more rapidly than the proportion that is under 60. The U.S. Census Bureau estimates that about 27 percent of Hawaii's population will be over age 60 by the year 2030, an increase of 33 percent from 2012. Numerous factors are contributing to this demographic revolution. The in-migration of older adults from the U.S. mainland, lower mortality rates, improved public health practices, advances in medicine and pharmaceuticals and declining birth rates among most ethnic groups are resulting in this age boom. Historically, Hawai'i has long been a state with a larger proportion of younger people. However, the percentage of elderly over 65 has overshot the national average since the year 2000 and today, there are very few states with a faster growing elderly population growth rate.

With over 130 years of meeting Hawaii's health care needs, St. Francis is known for pioneering new services and has focused recent efforts on the state's aging senior population. Our goal is to provide a comprehensive senior program where seniors can: 1) focus on staying active, healthy, and well. 2) get the support they need to care for their loved ones, 3) have access to a place of healing, 5) have a safe and nurturing place to live, age and play 6) find help and support through our call center 4) are cared for at the end of their lives with dignity.

This project would serve to meet this goal.

  The target population is seniors and those facing medical issues that
  require care in a 24 hour, 7 days a week facility. Those medical issues
  could range from early to late-stage dementia to ALS and those who have
  experienced a stroke and need full time care.
- 5. Describe the geographic coverage.

This project would serve seniors and those needing special accommodations that include healthcare services. Seniors or those needing special accommodations due to specific health challenges such as dementia or ALS would be served regardless of their current place of residence. The project would benefit anyone who lives in the State of Hawaii and qualifies for services.

St. Francis continues to be a recognized leader in home- and community-based care, a sector of the healthcare spectrum that has emerged as the single most critical area of growth to meet the needs of older adults.

With recent efforts focused on programs targeting the state's aging senior population, St. Francis predominantly serves low- to moderate-income seniors aged 62 and over and caregivers through programs at its Liliha campus, Franciscan Adult Day Center in Manoa, and St. Francis Intergenerational Center in Ewa Villages.

With recent opening of St. Francis Kupuna Village, we continue to meet the needs of Oahu's growing senior population and their caregivers through a one-stop health and wellness center. Hale O Meleana is a new senior living community featuring 111-units licensed to provide a full spectrum of senior care, including adult residential, assisted living, memory, intermediate level and skilled nursing. Kupuna Village offers wellness classes and workshops through the Senior Community Center, designed to give seniors a safe environment to engage in activities that promote healthy aging while encouraging socialization. The specially designed center also includes a simulation room to facilitate hands-on caregiver training and support services to ensure caregivers are equipped to serve their loved ones at home. Kupuna Village extends services for seniors that promote aging in place and avoid premature, costly and life-changing institutionalization.

In 2015, we opened a 50,000 sf 119-bed skilled nursing facility by upgrading three floors of the Sullivan Building at our Liliha campus. Seventy percent of rooms in the skilled nursing facility are private, many which offer panoramic views of the Honolulu skyline and serene views of Nuuanu Valley. The facility is part of the Kupuna Village, each floor is designed to create a vibrant healing environment that ensures patients can fully recover to prevent readmissions in hospital settings.

St. Francis successfully operates other senior programs through three adult day care programs that focus on client health and well-being through structured activities and social interaction in a safe group setting. St. Francis Intergenerational Center in Ewa Villages addresses the needs of the elderly and preschoolers residing in West Oahu, bringing keiki and kupuna together for joint activities through a shared space that offers adult day care and quality preschool education. St. Francis also oversees the management and operations of Franciscan Vistas Ewa, a vibrant, affordable senior independent living community that is 100% leased and features amenities typically found only in luxury living centers.

Prior to being named President, Correa served as Chief Operating Officer from 2007 through 2012, where he oversaw operational and financial performance of the different health services and programs.
