REPORT TO THE THIRTY-FIRST LEGISLATURE STATE OF HAWAII, PURSUANT TO HB541, HD1, SD 2, CD1, ESTABLISHING WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH A WORKING GROUP TO EVALUATE CURRENT BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CARE AND RELATED SYSTEMS AND IDENTIFY GAPS IN SERVICES, COORDINATE FUNDING SOURCES, AND ESTABLISH AND IDENTIFY OUTCOME MEASURES FOR PERSONS EXPERIENCING BEHAVIORAL HEALTH OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE CONDITIONS, AND RESULTANT CONSEQUENCES, INCLUDING HOMELESSNESS; AND TRANSMIT A REPORT OF FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE LEGISLATURE NO LESS THAN FORTY DAYS BEFORE THE CONVENING OF THE REGULAR SESSION OF 2022.
