REPORT ON THE NUMBER OF PEN REGISTER ORDERS AND ORDERS FOR TRAP AND TRACE DEVICES APPLIED FOR BY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES OF THE STATE

Pursuant to Section 803-47(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes

December 27, 2021

Section 803-47(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires that "[t]he attorney general, at least twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session, shall annually report to the legislature on the number of pen register orders and orders for trap and trace devices applied for by law enforcement agencies of the State."

From December 15, 2020, to the date of this report, there were sixteen pen register orders applied for and granted, and one trap and trace device order applied for and granted. Additionally, there was one trap and trace device extension order applied for and granted. These orders were sought by the Maui County Police Department.
