# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE IMPORTANT AGRICULTURAL LAND QUALIFIED AGRICULTURAL COST TAX CREDIT.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the important
- 2 agricultural land qualified agricultural cost tax credit
- 3 supports food self-sufficiency by providing tax credits to
- 4 qualified landowners and farmers to help offset costs related to
- 5 establishing and sustaining viable agricultural operations;
- 6 however, under existing law, the department of agriculture must
- 7 cease certifying these tax credits for taxable years beginning
- 8 after December 31, 2021. The legislature further finds that
- 9 extending the tax credit will provide additional time to
- 10 landowners and farmers to claim the tax credit in the event that
- 11 their agricultural lands are identified as potential important
- 12 agricultural lands and subsequently designated as such by the
- 13 land use commission.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to extend the period during
- 15 which the important agricultural land qualified agricultural
- 16 cost tax credit is available.

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 235-110.93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows:
- 3 "(1) The department of agriculture shall cease certifying
- 4 credits pursuant to this section for taxable years beginning
- 5 after December 31, [2021;] 2030; provided that a taxpayer with
- 6 accumulated, but unclaimed, certified credits may continue
- 7 claiming the credits in subsequent taxable years until
- 8 exhausted."
- 9 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022, and
- 12 shall apply to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2021.
