A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMERCIAL ENTERPRISES IN SCHOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to allow for greater
2 implementation of commercial enterprises in schools by:

3 (1) Deeming student interns engaging in commercial
4 enterprises to be employees of the State; and

5 (2) Allowing the department of education to use revenue
6 generated from school commercial enterprises.

7 SECTION 2. Section 302A-448, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8 amended to read as follows:

9 "[-] §302A-448 [+] Schools; career pathways, academies, and
10 programs; commercial enterprises. (a) Notwithstanding any law
11 to the contrary, an individual department school or any career
12 pathway, academy, or program operated within a school may engage
13 in commercial enterprises that are related to the primary
14 educational purposes of the school, career pathway, academy, or
15 program as set forth in this chapter, including the sale of
16 goods produced by or for an individual school, career pathway,
17 academy, or program.



1 (b) Student interns engaging in commercial enterprises
2 under subsection (a) shall be considered "employees of the
3 State" for purposes of chapter 662.

4 (c) Revenues accrued and expenditures made by the
5 department for the operation of commercial enterprises,
6 including those relating to hiring of personnel; renovation of
7 commercial space; and the purchase of merchandise, supplies, and
8 equipment, shall be accrued and made without regard to chapters
9 76, 78, 89, 103, and 103D. Net profits generated pursuant to
10 this section and section 302A-1903 may be used by the department
11 in accordance with this chapter.

12 ~~[(b)]~~ (d) The department may adopt rules pursuant to
13 chapter 91 to carry out the purposes of this section."


14 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
