ACT 1 6 5 H.B. NO. H.D. S.D.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MANDATORY ETHICS TRAINING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that requiring all state
- 2 legislators and employees to be aware of and knowledgeable about
- 3 the state ethics code is in the best interests of the State.
- 4 Regular training on the state ethics code will ensure that state
- 5 legislators and employees are aware of current ethics laws and
- 6 will increase the public's confidence in state government.
- 7 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish live
- 8 and online ethics training courses to be designed and
- 9 administered by the state ethics commission and make ethics
- 10 training mandatory for all state legislators and employees.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 84-42, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- "[f]\$84-42[f] Mandatory ethics training course. [All
- 14 state officers and employees enumerated in section 84-41] (a)
- 15 Legislators, members of the board of education, trustees of the
- 16 office of Hawaiian affairs, the governor, the lieutenant
- 17 governor, executive department heads and deputies, and every

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1	other person whose financial disclosure statement is a public
2	record pursuant to section 84-17(d) shall complete [an] a live
3	ethics training course administered by the state ethics
4	commission (as provided in this part. For the purposes of this
5	part, "ethics training" includes education and training in:
6	(1) The ethics laws set forth in this chapter; and
7	(2) The lobbying laws set forth in chapter 97.] within
8	ninety days of taking office and at least once every
9	four years thereafter.
10	(b) All other employees shall complete either a live or ar
11	online ethics training course developed pursuant to section 84-
12	43(c) and administered by the state ethics commission within
13	ninety days of becoming an employee and at least once every four
14	years thereafter."
15	SECTION 3. Section 84-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	"§84-43 Ethics training [eourse.] courses; live and
18	online. (a) The state ethics commission shall establish,
19	design, supervise, and conduct <u>live and online</u> ethics training
20	courses for [the officers and employees to whom this part

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1	applies.]	all persons required to complete training under
2	section 8	4-42.
3	(b)	The <u>live</u> ethics training course <u>may be conducted in</u>
4	person or	via videoconference and shall include:
5	(1)	Explanations and discussions of the ethics laws,
6		administrative rules, and relevant internal policies;
7	(2)	Specific technical and legal requirements;
8	(3)	The underlying purposes and principles of ethics laws;
9	(4)	Examples of practical application of the laws and
10		principles; and
11	(5)	A question-and-answer participatory segment regarding
12		common problems and situations.
13	The state	ethics commission shall develop the methods and
14	prepare a	ny materials necessary to implement the <u>live ethics</u>
15	training	course.
16	(c)	The online ethics training course shall include
17	explanati	ons, discussions, and examples of the practical
18	applicati	on of ethics laws and principles as the state ethics
19	commissio	n deems appropriate. The state ethics commission shall
20	develop t	he methods and prepare any materials necessary to
21	implement	the online ethics training course, which may include

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1	previously	y recorded ethics training courses originally conducted
2	either in	person or via videoconference and any other
3	prerecorde	ed material authorized by the state ethics commission.
4	[-(c)]	(d) The state ethics commission shall:
5	(1)	[Administer] Design and administer the live ethics
6		training [eourse;
7	(2)	Designate those of its legal staff who are to conduct
8		the <u>live</u> ethics training course; [and]
9	(3)	Notify each [officer] legislator or employee
10		[enumerated in section 84-41], either directly or via
11		the employee's employing agency, that their attendance
12		or participation in [this] an applicable ethics
13		training course is mandatory[-]; provided that a
14		legislator's or employee's non-receipt of notice shall
15		not be a defense to a charge concerning a violation of
16		this chapter; and
17	(4)	Design and administer the online ethics training
18		course.
19	[-(d)-	<u>(e)</u> The state ethics commission may repeat the <u>live</u>
20	course as	necessary to accommodate all persons who are required
2.1	to attend	

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1	$\left[\frac{(e)}{(e)}\right]$ Each state agency shall provide to the state
2	ethics commission in a timely manner the names and electronic
3	<pre>mail addresses of those persons required to take the applicable</pre>
4	course [in a timely manner] and shall assist the commission by
5	providing adequate meeting facilities, equipment, and technical
6	support as needed for the ethics training [eourse.] courses."
7	SECTION 4. Section 84-41, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	repealed.
9	["\$84-41 Applicability of part. This part applies to
10	legislators, members of the board of education, trustees of the
11	office of Hawaiian affairs, the governor, the lieutenant
12	governor, and executive department heads and deputies. This
13	part does not apply to any other officer or employee of the
14	State."]
15	SECTION 5. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, all
16	state legislators and employees who are in active service on the
17	effective date of this Act shall successfully complete a live or
18	an online ethics training course, as applicable, within twelve
19	months following the effective date of this Act and at least
20	once every four years thereafter; provided that the requirement
21	to successfully complete an ethics training course within the

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- 1 twelve month period immediately following the effective date of
- 2 this Act shall not apply to those state legislators or employees
- 3 who, within the past three years from the effective date of this
- 4 Act, have successfully completed a live or an online ethics
- 5 training course, as applicable.
- 6 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2023.
