# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The departments and agencies listed in section
- 2 of this Act shall provide grants to federal tax-exempt
- 3 nonprofit organizations to support their organizational mission.
- 4 The grants shall be tailored toward improving Native
- 5 Hawaiian communities and culture through various assistance
- 6 programs, including but not limited to programs that offer
- 7 Native Hawaiian historic preservation, business training,
- 8 entrepreneurship, and mentoring.
- 9 The grants shall be awarded in conformance with the
- 10 standards in section 42F-103, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 11 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,000,000 or so much
- 13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to be
- 14 allocated to the following departments and agencies and used for
- 15 grants pursuant to section 1 of this Act for the following
- 16 programs:
