# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ABANDONED VEHICLES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

Ţ	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there has been a
2	rise in abandoned vehicles within the State, necessitating a
3	large amount of funding for the counties to dispose of the
4	abandoned vehicles. To offset the costs, charges and fines are
5	levied against individuals who abandon their vehicles. However,
6	there is no current mechanism that requires the individuals to
7	pay the charges within a reasonable timeframe, resulting in
8	numerous outstanding cases within the State.
9	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
10	(1) Authorize the director of finance of a county to
11	require payment of outstanding charges and fines
12	relating to the disposition of an abandoned vehicle
13	before issuing a certificate of registration or
14	completing a transfer of ownership, except under
15	certain circumstances; and
16	(2) Require a county director of finance to notify the
17	appropriate county examiner of drivers of the

1	individuals who have outstanding charges and fines
2	owed to the county relating to the disposition of an
3	abandoned vehicle for the purposes of suspending,
4	revoking, or prohibiting the renewal of their driver's
5	licenses.
6	SECTION 2. Chapter 290, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
8	and to read as follows:
9	"§290- Abandoned vehicles; prohibition on transfer;
10	suspension, revocation, or prohibition of renewal of driver's
11	license; notification. (a) The county director of finance
12	shall deny issuance of a certificate of registration, in
13	accordance with section 286-51, and prohibit completion of any
14	transfer of ownership, in accordance with sections 286-52 and
15	286-52.5, of an abandoned vehicle whose registered owner has
16	outstanding charges and fines relating to the disposition of the
17	abandoned vehicle, including for costs related to towing,
18	storage, processing, and disposal.
19	(b) The county director of finance shall notify the
20	appropriate county examiner of drivers of any registered owners
21	of abandoned vehicles in the county who have outstanding charges

2	The county examiner of drivers shall then suspend, revoke, or
3	prohibit the renewal of the registered owner's driver's license
4	in accordance with sections 286-107 and 286-119."
5	SECTION 3. Section 286-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
7	"(a) The certificate of registration for each motor
8	vehicle in the counties of the State shall be renewed on a
9	staggered basis as established by each county. The director of
10	finance of each county may adopt rules to carry out the purposes
11	stated in this section and shall expend the [necessary] funds
12	from the director's operating funds as may be necessary for
13	these purposes; provided that [the director of finance,] if the
14	director has ascertained as of the date of the application that
15	[ <del>the</del> ]:
16	(1) The registered owner has not deposited or paid bail
17	with respect to any summons or citation issued to the
18	registered owner for stopping, standing, or parking in
19	violation of traffic ordinances within the county[, or
20	<del>the</del> ] <u>;</u>

1	(2)	The registered owner of a motor carrier vehicle, as	
2		defined in section 286-201, has not resolved any	
3		outstanding federal operations out-of-service orders	
4		issued by the United States Secretary of

7		owed to the county relating to the disposition of an	
8		abandoned vehicle, including for costs related to	
9		towing, storage, processing, and disposal,	
10	the director may require, as a condition precedent to the		
11	renewal, that the registered owner deposit or pay bail with		
12	respect to all such summonses or citations, [or] resolve all		
13	federal operations out-of-service orders[-], or pay all		
14	outstanding charges and fines relating to the disposition of the		
15	abandoned	vehicle. The payment of all outstanding charges or	
16	fines relating to the disposition of the abandoned vehicle shal		
17	not be a	condition precedent to the transfer if the abandoned	
18	vehicle w	as stolen or taken from the registered owner without	
19	permissio	n or authorization and a police report for the	
20	abandoned vehicle is filed within a period of time, to be		
21	determine	ed by the director of finance of each county, after	

- 1 discovery of the abandoned vehicle. The certificates of
- 2 registration issued hereunder shall show, in addition to all
- 3 information required under section 286-47, the serial number of
- 4 the tag or emblem and shall be valid during the registration
- 5 year only for which they are issued. Any certificate of
- 6 registration belonging to a motor carrier shall be suspended or
- 7 revoked when that motor carrier has been issued any federal
- 8 operations out-of-service orders by the United States Secretary
- 9 of Transportation and that certificate of registration shall
- 10 remain suspended or revoked until all the federal operations
- 11 out-of-service orders are resolved. The certificates of
- 12 ownership need not be renewed annually but shall remain valid as
- 13 to any interest shown therein until canceled by the director of
- 14 finance as provided by law or replaced by new certificates of
- 15 ownership as hereinafter provided."
- 16 SECTION 4. Section 286-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
- "(c) Subsection (b), requiring a transferee to forward the
- 19 certificate of ownership after endorsement to the director of
- 20 finance, shall not apply to the transferee of a vehicle who was
- 21 not intending to and does not drive the vehicle or permit the

- 1 vehicle to be driven upon the public highways, but every such
- 2 transferee, upon transferring the transferee's interest or title
- 3 to another, shall give notice of the transfer to the director of
- 4 finance and endorse the certificate of ownership to the new
- 5 legal owner and the certificate of registration to the new
- 6 owner[; provided that if]. If the director of finance has
- 7 ascertained as of the date of the application that the
- 8 registered owner has not deposited or paid bail with respect to
- 9 any summons or citation issued to the registered owner for
- 10 stopping, standing, or parking in violation of traffic
- 11 ordinances within the county  $[\tau]$  or has outstanding charges and
- 12 fines owed to the county relating to the disposition of an
- 13 abandoned vehicle under the registered owner, including for
- 14 costs related to towing, storage, processing, and disposal, the
- 15 director may require, as a condition precedent to the transfer,
- 16 that the registered owner deposit or pay bail with respect to
- 17 all such summons or citations[-] or pay all outstanding charges
- 18 and fines relating to the disposition of the abandoned vehicle;
- 19 provided that payment of all outstanding charges and fines
- 20 relating to the disposition of the abandoned vehicle shall not
- 21 be a condition precedent to the transfer if the abandoned

Section 286-110, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (h) to read as follows: 2 3 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the 4 examiner of drivers may issue an instruction permit to an 5 applicant with a disability who has completed a medical review with this State, and as a condition to licensure is required to 7 pass a road test, but has failed the road test on the applicant's first attempt. The instruction permit issued under 8 9 this subsection may be renewed no more than thirty days prior to or ninety days after the expiration date of the instruction 10 11 permit upon receiving an updated medical report. Subsections (b)(2) and (3) shall not apply to the issuance or renewal of an 12 instruction permit issued under this subsection. 13 14 For the purposes of this subsection, "applicant with a 15 disability" means an applicant who the examiner of drivers has reasonable cause to believe may have a mental or physical 16 17 infirmity or disability that would make it unsafe to operate a motor vehicle pursuant to section [286-119] 286-119(a)(1) and 18 has been medically evaluated by the medical advisory board 19 established pursuant to section 286-4.1." 20

18	this sect	ion, the examiner shall immediately notify the licensee
19	and afford the licensee a hearing. After the hearing, the	
20	examiner	of drivers may rescind the suspension, or the examiner
21	may suspe	and the license for a further period or revoke the

- 1 license. Any person whose license has been suspended or revoked
- 2 under this section may appeal under section 286-129."
- 3 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
