

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO IMPROVING ACCESS TO PSYCHIATRIC CARE FOR MEDICAID PATIENTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the psychiatric
- 2 collaborative care model of integrated care is ideal for states
- 3 with community populations that are remote from urban centers
- 4 because the model does not require the physical presence of a
- 5 psychiatrist when psychiatric services can be delivered
- 6 remotely. The psychiatric collaborative care model supports
- 7 mental and behavioral health through a team-based, coordinated
- 8 approach involving a psychiatric consultant, a behavioral health
- 9 care manager, and the primary care clinician extending beyond
- 10 the scope of an office visit.
- 11 The legislature further finds that the Centers for Medicare
- 12 and Medicaid Services has released a medicare fee schedule that
- 13 includes healthcare common procedure coding system G codes and
- 14 fees for psychiatric collaborative care management services,
- 15 which allows primary care physicians to be reimbursed for

- 1 services that psychiatrists provide in the collaborative care
- 2 model.
- 3 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to specify that
- 4 coverage for telehealth under the State's medicaid managed care
- 5 and fee-for-service programs includes psychiatric services
- 6 delivered via telehealth through a behavioral health care
- 7 manager who is present in a primary health care provider's
- 8 office.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 346-59.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 "[+]\$346-59.1[+] Coverage for telehealth. (a) The
- 12 State's medicaid managed care and fee-for-service programs shall
- 13 not deny coverage for any service provided through telehealth
- 14 that would be covered if the service were provided through in-
- 15 person consultation between a patient and a health care
- 16 provider.
- 17 (b) Required coverage for services under subsection (a)
- 18 includes psychiatric services provided to a patient by a
- 19 collaborative care team consisting of a primary care provider
- 20 and behavioral health care manager, who shall be present in the
- 21 primary care provider's office, in conjunction with a



- 1 psychiatric consultant whose services may be delivered remotely
- 2 through telehealth; provided that the psychiatric consultant
- 3 shall be a licensed psychiatrist in the State.
- 4 [\(\frac{(b)}{c}\)] (c) Reimbursement for services provided through
- 5 telehealth shall be equivalent to reimbursement for the same
- 6 services provided via face-to-face contact between a health care
- 7 provider and a patient. Nothing in this section shall require a
- 8 health care provider to be physically present with the patient
- 9 at an originating site unless a health care provider at the
- 10 distant site deems it necessary.
- 11 [(c)] (d) There shall be no geographic restrictions or
- 12 requirements for telehealth coverage or reimbursement under this
- 13 section.
- 14 [(d)] (e) There shall be no restrictions on originating
- 15 site requirements for telehealth coverage or reimbursement under
- 16 this section.
- 17 [(e)] (f) Services provided by telehealth pursuant to this
- 18 section shall be consistent with all federal and state privacy,
- 19 security, and confidentiality laws.
- 20 [(f)] (g) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary,
- 21 the provisions of this section shall comply with the applicable



- 1 federal requirements related to utilization, coverage, and
- 2 reimbursement for telehealth services.
- $[\frac{g}{g}]$ (h) For the purposes of this section:
- 4 "Behavioral health care manager" means a nurse, social
- 5 worker, licensed counselor, or psychologist, who coordinates the
- 6 overall effort of the collaborative care team, ensures effective
- 7 communication among team members, provides psychotherapy when
- 8 that is part of the treatment plan, and is responsible for
- 9 coordinating and supporting mental health care within the clinic
- 10 and for coordinating referrals to clinically indicated services
- 11 outside the clinic.
- 12 "Distant site" means the location of the health care
- 13 provider delivering services through telehealth at the time the
- 14 services are provided.
- 15 "Health care provider" means a provider of services, as
- 16 defined in title 42 United States Code section 1395x(u), a
- 17 provider of medical and other health services, as defined in
- 18 title 42 United States Code section 1395x(s), other
- 19 practitioners licensed by the State and working within their
- 20 scope of practice, and any other person or organization who
- 21 furnishes, bills, or is paid for health care in the normal



- 1 course of business, including but not limited to primary care
- 2 providers, mental health providers, oral health providers,
- 3 physicians and osteopathic physicians licensed under chapter
- 4 453, advanced practice registered nurses licensed under chapter
- 5 457, psychologists licensed under chapter 465, and dentists
- 6 licensed under chapter 448.
- 7 "Originating site" means the location where the patient is
- 8 located, whether accompanied or not by a health care provider,
- 9 at the time services are provided by a health care provider
- 10 through telehealth, including but not limited to a health care
- 11 provider's office, hospital, critical access hospital, rural
- 12 health clinic, federally qualified health center, a patient's
- 13 home, and other non-medical environments such as school-based
- 14 health centers, university-based health centers, or the work
- 15 location of a patient.
- 16 "Telehealth" means the use of telecommunications services,
- 17 as defined in section 269-1, to encompass four modalities:
- 18 store and forward technologies, remote monitoring, live
- 19 consultation, and mobile health; and which shall include but not
- 20 be limited to real-time video conferencing-based communication,
- 21 secure interactive and non-interactive web-based communication,

- 1 and secure asynchronous information exchange, to transmit
- 2 patient medical information, including diagnostic-quality
- 3 digital images and laboratory results for medical interpretation
- 4 and diagnosis, for the purpose of delivering enhanced health
- 5 care services and information while a patient is at an
- 6 originating site and the health care provider is at a distant
- 7 site. Standard telephone contacts, facsimile transmissions, or
- 8 e-mail text, in combination or by itself, does not constitute a
- 9 telehealth service for the purposes of this section."
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 11 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 12 begun before its effective date.
- 13 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
