RELATING TO REPORTS FILED WITH THE CAMPAIGN SPENDING COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1.	Section 11-334, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

11	(C)	Ten calendar days before a primary, initial
12		special, or initial nonpartisan election;
13	(D)	October 1 of the year of a general election;

15	(E)	Ten calendar days before a general, subsequent
16		special, or subsequent nonpartisan election;
17		[provided that this preliminary report does not

1		need to be filed by a candidate who is

7		subparagraphs (D) and (E) shall not be required from a

12		preliminary report filed by the date required under
13		subparagraph (B) shall be current through June 30, and
14		all other preliminary reports shall be current through
15		the fifth calendar day before the filing deadline of

17	(2)	The filing date for the final primary report is twenty
18		calendar days after a primary, initial special, or
19		initial nonpartisan election. The report shall be
20		current through the day of the applicable election;

1	(3)	The filing date for the final election period report
2		is thirty calendar days after a general, subsequent,
3		subsequent special, or subsequent nonpartisan
4		election. The report shall be current through the day
5		of the applicable election. The final election period
6		report shall be filed by a candidate who is
7		unsuccessful in a primary, initial special, or initial
8		nonpartisan election or a candidate who is elected to
9		office in the primary, initial special, or initial
10		nonpartisan election; provided that a candidate who is
11		elected and is to be sworn into office [prior to]
12		before thirty calendar days after a general,
13		subsequent, subsequent special, or subsequent
14		nonpartisan election in which the candidate was
15		elected, shall file the final election period report
16		three business days before the date the candidate is
17		to be sworn into office; and
18	(4)	The filing dates for supplemental reports are:
19		(A) January 31 annually; and
20		(B) July 31 after an election year.

Campaign Spending Commission Package; Committee Reports; Time for Candidates to File Preliminary Reports; Time for Committees to Notify Commission of Intent to Receive and Spend in the Aggregate \$1,000 or Less

Description:

Housekeeping measure that provides that candidates are not required to file preliminary general reports if they are either unsuccessful or are elected to office in the primary election. Amends subsections (b) and (c) of section 11-339, HRS, to make them consistent with subsection (a) by aggregating contributions and expenditures in determining whether a committee need only file the final election period report.
