A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONCESSIONS ON PUBLIC PROPERTY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that government entities
- 2 often experience difficulty attracting interested and qualified
- 3 bidders to provide concession services on public property. One
- 4 reason for the lack of bidders is the law that restricts how
- 5 government entities may inform the public of available
- 6 concession spaces.
- 7 The legislature further finds that allowing concession
- 8 contracts to be advertised through print or online notifications
- 9 will expand the reach of those advertisements and encourage more
- 10 competition among bidders, generate greater interest in
- 11 concession services, and help capitalize sources of revenue.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to amend the requirements for
- 13 the advertising of concession contracts on public property.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 102-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 "§102-4 Advertisement for bids. [Public notice]
- 17 Advertisement of a call for bids shall be made either by:
